On October 30 2021 I personally visually inspected and evaluated the vehicle described below for the purpose of providing an estimate of the vehicle's cash/fair market value today. I inspected the vehicle's exterior, interior, chassis, and engine compartment. A mechanical evaluation was conducted where possible. The evaluation is based upon authenticity, preservation/ restoration, maintenance and/or replacement costs.

Special Features

(Mileage: 54,790) This is a rare Volkswagen LX Caddy Utility (Pickup). The current owner purchased it from a seller in Washington state. This is a #2 condition, very nice all original VW Caddy Pickup.

Engine/Engine Compartment: (Overall Condition Grade 2) The engine and all components/accessories appear to be original.









Chassis: (Overall Condition Grade 2) 5-Speed manual transmission. Every part of the chassis and drivetrain is original except for the tires. The shocks are believed to be original. The shock towers are in very good condition. The wheels are believed to be a special option. The spare tire appears to be original. Much of the frame has been treated with a rust proofing material/coating.









Interior: (Overall Condition Grade 2) The only two items/components of the interior that are not original are the radio and the headliner. The owner does have the original radio. The original factory clock is in working condition. The vehicle has manual reclining seats. The headliner is not original, however it is in

excellent condition. The original headliner would have been vinyl, the current headliner is a cloth material. The vehicle has manual windows and door locks. It has a factory vanity mirror on the passenger side sunvisor. The interior is in near perfect condition, showing very little signs of wear.

















Exterior: (Overall Condition Grade 2) The exterior paint is in fine condition. It has a very nice shine to it. The vehicle has dual manual remote mirrors that are in good working condition. The driver's wing/vent window needs to be re-glued, it will fall out if opened. The bed is in very good condition and currently has a

rubber bed liner mat installed. The bumper chrome is in fine condition. The left rear bumper is slightly out of alignment. The exterior body emblems are in excellent condition. The left side lower body trim moulding/chrome trim needs to be reattached at the very forward portion. The body panels align up near perfectly. The vehicle has no current damage except for the left side rear bumper that needs to be aligned. The exterior graphics are in excellent condition and the colors are still bright with no fading. The chrome work and glass are also in excellent condition.























Summary/Comments

This is a low mileage #2 condition VW Pickup Caddy model. All of the factory placards are still on the vehicle and they are in fine condition. The current owner has the original keys. At the time of the appraisal, there were several recent sales of 1981 model year equivalents that sold between \$15,700 and \$20,000. All of these comparables had much higher mileage and were not in as good condition as the appraised vehicle. Some of the comparables were not original, they had different engines and/or were repainted.

After careful evaluation of this vehicle, based on my expertise and experience (and after consulting Old Cars Price Guide, NADA, Collector Car Auction Results, The Production Figure Book for U.S. Cars, the Internet, reviewing the *International Vehicle Appraisers Network* database, reviewing comparables, etc. and after consulting with other Professional Appraisers, museums, and automotive experts, etc., when necessary, I appraise (estimate) this vehicle as having a cash value of \$22,700.00 USD.

Harry grew up around classic cars, hot rods, motorcycles, planes, and boats. Harry has been riding motorcycles for 50 years and boating/sailing a little longer.
