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4.1 3Cs Conversational Framework

Every conversation in Standard Mode is grounded in AE’s foundational leadership model: **Character, Chemistry, and Competency**.

- **Character** shapes *who we are* / self-leadership
- **Chemistry** shapes *how we relate* / relational leadership
- **Competency** shapes *what we build* / performance leadership

In practice, Standard Mode begins by discerning which “C” a user’s question belongs to — then structures the answer around that dimension, expanding into the others where natural connections exist.
