


2024/2025 SoTL Scholars Grant Information

The Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) is the systematic study of teaching and learning with the intent to share the findings with the wider academic community (Bishop-Clark & Dietz-Uhler, 2012). For more detailed information, visit the <u>Center for Engaged Pedagogy at Elon University</u>. As a teaching university, we are uniquely positioned to conduct SoTL research. We have a lot of teaching expertise at SSU, and sharing the work we do with the broader academic community will impact teaching practices internationally. The purpose of the SoTL Scholars Grant program is to provide faculty who are new to



the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning the resources and opportunity to create, implement, and disseminate their own SoTL research project. The SoTL Scholars program runs from Jun 10, 2024 until June 1, 2025 and will have a number of deliverables detailed below. Five Scholars will be chosen for the pilot of this program, and each participant will receive a \$1,000 stipend and a copy of Engaging in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning: A Guide to the Process, and How to Develop a Project from Start to Finish by Cathy Bishop-Clark and Beth Dietz-Uhler. Faculty need to be teaching the course of interest in Fall 2024. Those selected will be required to attend a three-day long SoTL institute, in which the deliverables will be explained in greater detail. At the end of this program,

faculty will leave with a completed project and submission to at least one publication or conference.

Faculty who are new to SoTL research are particularly encouraged to apply.

- Open to full-time and part-time faculty
- Proposals are due by May 1, 2024
- Those who receive the grant will be notified by May 17, 2024
- Three-day institute (required; in-person) in summer (June 10-12, 2024)
- Group check-ins throughout the year
- Individual support provided as needed
