STROKE SMART MEDICAL PRACTICE

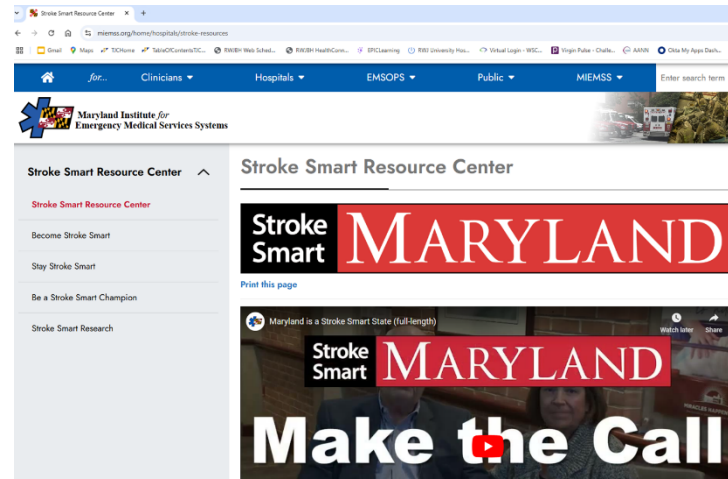
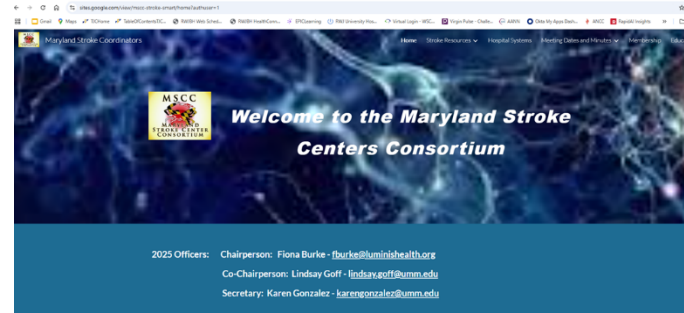
Tragically, one in three stroke patients first call their medical provider to request an office appointment rather than 911 because they do not recognize the medical emergency. This delay can result in death or a lifetime disability for the patient. Stroke Smart

Medical Practice aims to educate the public and medical office staff to recognize patient stroke signs and actions to take. Through adopting (3) actions, we can save lives and reduce disability from strokes.

1. Train office staff to spot strokes and follow practice protocol if a stroke is suspected.
2. Ensure Stroke Smart education and materials are accessible to all patients.
3. Identify high risk patients and provide targeted Stroke Smart education.
4. Incorporate Stroke Smart script in phone system recordings.
5. Track metrics on Stroke Smart program activities.

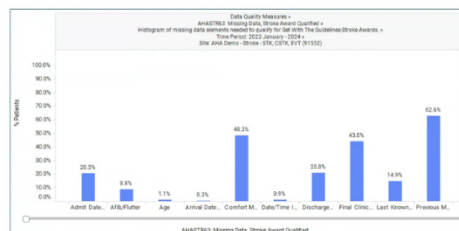

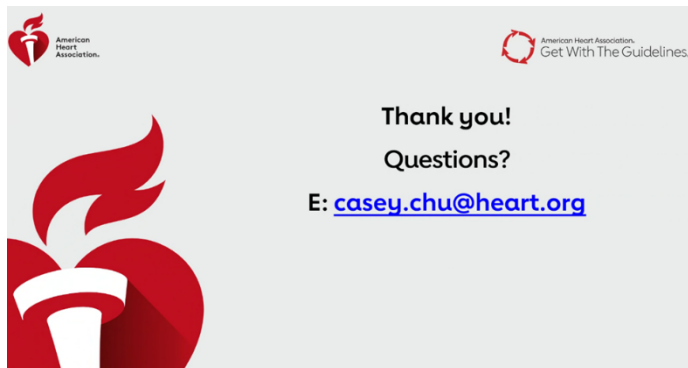
