Behind Fossilised Rock, there is a natural time capsule.

Fossil Rock, named for its fossilised sea creatures dating back 80 million years, is best explored in winter and is located near Sharjah in the Al Madam area. The hike up the Fossil Rock, ancient fossils of ammonites, clams, and sea urchins, feels like stepping into a natural time capsule. The Fossil Rock hike in Sharjah can be 6–10 kilometres long, depending on the trail. The hike can take 2-4 hours, depending on the trail and difficulty level.

Trail lengths

- **8 km out-and-back:** This trail is moderately difficult and includes some technical rock scrambling.
- 6 km loop: This trail includes dunes, rock, and a cliff climb.
- 10 km ascend: This trail is intermediate to steep.
- 10.3 km circular loop: This trail is moderately challenging and is popular for hiking and running.

The UAE experiences mild winters with temperatures ranging from 10°C to 25°C. However, nights can get chilly, especially in the desert, so it is advisable to wear layers.

Is it necessary to wear traditional Emirati clothing in winter?

While tourists do not need to wear traditional Emirati clothing, it can be respectful. Emirati men wear the "Kandura," and women wear the "Abaya," both of which can be adapted with warmer fabrics for winter.

What types of winter wear dresses are suitable for women visiting the UAE?

For women, the "Abaya," a long black cloak, is a staple, often paired with thicker or layered clothing underneath to provide warmth during cooler weather. While the UAE's winter is mild, it's a good idea to pack lightweight or long-sleeve maxi dresses. These options provide warmth during cooler evenings and are stylish enough for exploring city attractions. Pair with a light jacket or shawl for added comfort during winter. Shawls and jackets can be worn over these garments, offering warmth and adherence to cultural norms.

What should men consider when packing winter wear for a trip to the UAE?

Traditionally, Emirati men wear the "Kandura," "Thobe," or "Dishdasha," a long white robe; this can be made from thicker fabric during winter months for extra warmth. Men should focus on layering with lightweight sweaters, long-sleeve shirts, and a medium-weight jacket. For daytime outings, pair these with chinos or denim. A scarf can add extra warmth when venturing into the desert or mountains. To complement the Kandura, men often wear the "Ghutra" or "Shemagh," a traditional headscarf that can also be made from warmer materials during winter.
