

Conwy and Pembroke class superhero ideas.

<p><u>Literacy, Language and Communication</u></p> <p>- Read to your child and ask them to retell the story in their own words. You could ask them to draw a picture and describe their favourite part/ character. Pembroke class you have access to Giglets online reading (please email us if you do not have your login).</p> <p>-Continue to practise Set 1 and Set 2 Read Write Inc sounds (they were included in your pack at the end of term). Online Read Write Inc sessions start back on 20/4/20. https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIq9GdxtQ</p> <p>www.facebook.com/miskin.education/</p> <p>- Practise spelling cvc words/ tricky words and High Frequency words (we sent a list of these home) here is a link to HFW https://www.highfrequencywords.org/hfw100fp.pdf</p> <p>- Talk about our 5 senses, then lead onto superheroes super powers e.g super strength, flying etc. Ask children what they think their super power is e.g being a fast runner, good at art.</p> <p>- Discuss which superheroes children like and dislike, ask them to give reasons why and see if they can write a few sentences about it including capital letters, finger spaces and full stops e.g I like superman because he can fly high in the sky.</p> <p>- Follow the link to these superhero books, read and discuss them with your child. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rze89HB9u8g https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7Jnk3XApKBg</p>	<p><u>Mathematical Development</u></p> <p>- Counting up to 20 and back from 10? Can you sing a welsh counting song? (un, dau, tri banana... on youtube) https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/3-5-years/counting https://www.youtube.com/results?search_query=un+dau+tri+banana+</p> <p>- Reading and writing numbers to 20. You could make number flashcards, paint numbers, write numbers with chalk outside, write rainbow numbers.</p> <p>- Money- count first in 1p, 2ps, 5ps then 10p coins. Children could make different amounts and put them in a purse. Children could play shop by putting different prices on household objects. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/3-5-years/money https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/money</p> <p>- Sorting objects e.g anything you have in the house e.g coins/coloured objects/shapes etc. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/3-5-years/ordering-and-sequencing https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/ordering</p> <p>- Temperature- talk about changes in weather and discuss hot and cold. Also compare and discuss hot and cold objects (children could point them out around the house). See if children can sing the 'sut mae'r tywydd heddiw' song and say basic sentences 'mae hi'n oer/ heulog/ boeth/ bwrw glaw'.</p>
<p><u>Creative Development</u></p>	<p><u>Physical Development</u></p>

- Make super veggies together. Make a poster about your super veggie including their name and super power,



- Make superheroes out of salt dough or make superhero cookies.



- Use recycled materials to invent your own superhero. Children could then write a list of the materials they have used.



- Paint a picture of your family as superheroes (You could use paint or use a paint program on a computer or tablet).
- Make a superhero mask.

- Do puzzles/ jigsaws together.

- Practise cutting out different shapes/ straight lines/ wiggly lines/ zigzag lines.

- There are lots of fun online workouts on Youtube- cosmic kids yoga, zumba for kids, Joe Wicks (The Body Coach) PE.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

- Go for scavenger hunts in the garden, can you spot a yellow flower, a woodlouse etc. Children could make a tally chart of what they find. Think of different shapes/ colours they could find.
- Go for a walk, discuss the 5 senses (what can you hear/ see etc).

Personal and Social Development

- Play a boardgame/ game together, encourage your child to take turns.
- Practise putting your coat on and zipping it up independently. Practise tying your own shoelaces.
- Practise hand washing for 20 seconds (sing the happy birthday song twice).
