## **AP WORLD HISTORY: MODERN**

### **COURSE CURRICULUM**

COURSE DESCRIPTION: AP World History: Modern is an introductory college-level modern world history course. Students will cultivate their understanding of world history from c. 1200 CE to the present through analyzing historical sources and learning to make connections and craft historical arguments as they explore concepts like humans and the environment, cultural developments and interactions, governance, economic systems, social interactions and organization, and technology and innovation. The course focuses on helping students understand the "narrative" of world history with the general trends/historical developments supported with factual evidence from around the world. Students are challenged to analyze comparison across plays, causation across time, and identify continuities and changes over time.

As part of this course students will improve their work in core skills, such as: reading comprehension of primary and secondary source texts, note-taking strategies, productive discussion, and writing in diverse formats.

This course fulfills the Geography course requirement for 9th grade and is an elective course offering for grade levels: 10th - 12th. Most students enrolled in AP World History are Freshman and Sophomore students.
