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Abstract

*The abstract section of a research paper should contain five key elements: the background, the aim of research objectives, the method or framework used, important results or conclusions, and suggestions. The abstract should be **no longer than 250 words** and should not include unusual or difficult-to-understand abbreviations. Additionally, an abstract should be written in both Indonesian and English if the full text is in Indonesian. If the full article is in English, then only one abstract in English is needed. The abstract should be written in **one paragraph**.*

1. INTRODUCTION

The introduction of a scientific article should include the research background, research problems and objectives, as well as a literature review.

It is recommended that scientific articles should have four main parts: **introduction, methods, results and discussion**, and **conclusion**. The article must consist of **7 to 10 pages**. Additionally, it includes thanks and a bibliography. The text should be written in **Times New Roman font size 12** and each paragraph should start with an **indent**. The article must use **single spacing** and between paragraphs should be 6 pt. The text should be **written in proper English**, with non-English words (including regional languages) written in italics. The file format accepted is Microsoft Word with the extensions *.doc and *.docx. Please send the files to the Google Form of ASCiting committee.

Technical Quotes

In-text quotations are written at the end or beginning of the sentence by writing the author's name and year of publication. Please follow APA Style (7th Edition) as citation and referencing guide. If there are up to two authors or authors, they are written with the author's last name (**Abdu & Bayu, 2010**). If there are more than two, the quotation is written with the first name of the author/author and et al. as well as the year of publication (**Badu et al., 2001**). Procedures for writing a bibliography must follow the standard format as can be seen in the Bibliography section at the bottom of this guide. In-text citations must be consistent with the Bibliography.

Figures and Tables

Images or graphs that are included in a paper should be inserted into the text with the title of the image or graph written at the bottom in the center position. The image should have sufficient resolution with grayscale or black and white. It is recommended that images be placed as close as possible to the explanation of the image or graphic. This is important because the images or graphs in the paper will be printed in grayscale or black and white.




Figure 1. Examples of images in papers (Synolakis, 1987).
