Project Description: In this assignment you research a painter and explore her or his work, and you will create your own work inspired by that painter.

Assessment: Your photo will be assessed using the **Photography Rubric**.

Procedure:

- 1. Choose an artist to research.
 - a. The artist's work must be in the public domain.
 - b. The selected painting must be a portrait.
- 2. Research your chosen artist and her or his work
 - a. Look at a variety of his or her work
 - b. Read about the artist's life, history, achievements, techniques, etc.
- 3. Answer the research questions below.
 - a. Who did you choose to research?

- 5. Respond to the Reflection Questions:
 - a. What did you find challenging about creating work that is connected to history?
 - b. Why do you think this is an important exercise for photographers?
 - c. Read the Scriptures for meditation above. What contrasts do you see in the different scriptures found in Proverbs?
 - d. How would you describe your own pursuit of wisdom and knowledge?
 - e. Why do you think God wants us to honor the aged?
