## The Winter Games:

Every <u>four</u> years, athletes from around the world gather to <u>compete</u> in the Winter Games of the Olympics. The athletes, who <u>train</u> extremely hard, are chosen to <u>represent</u> their countries. The games begin with the <u>opening</u> ceremony, where the athletes <u>parade</u> in front of an audience.

## The Events:

The Winter Games comprises many different <u>events</u>. There are sledding events such as <u>luge</u> and the <u>bobsled</u>. There are skiing events such as <u>alpine</u> and <u>cross country</u>. There are also team sports such as <u>ice hockey</u>. Every Olympics some new events are added such as <u>snowboarding</u>, which was added in the 1998 Nagano Olympic Games.

## Winning:

The dream of every athlete is to make it to the <u>podium</u>, which is where the medals are handed out. The first place winners receive the <u>gold</u> medal and have the <u>honor</u> of hearing their countries' <u>national anthems</u> played. The second place winners receive the <u>silver</u> medal and the third place winners receive the <u>bronze</u> medal. Often, the winners are <u>determined</u> by who has the <u>fastest</u> time. Events such as the <u>figure</u> skating are decided this way. Other events such as <u>speed</u> skating are determined by a panel of <u>judges</u>, who give marks according to artistic and technical ability.
