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Many female patients come to the health clinic with complaints of vaginal discharge and other associated symptoms. Vaginitis, or inflammation of the vagina, is the most common gynecologic condition presenting with these symptoms. The most common causes of vaginitis are candida vaginitis and bacterial vaginosis. Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) such as chlamydia, gonorrhea, and trichomoniasis are additional differential diagnoses to consider for these gynecological complaints. During this presentation, health care providers will increase their knowledge about medication treatment guidelines (antibiotics and antifungals) to treat these various conditions. There will also be a review of alternative medication regimens available to patients. Counseling techniques and patient education resources will be discussed. Significant morbidity such as Pelvic Inflammatory Disease (PID) can occur in the absence of early detection and treatment of these vaginal conditions.
