- Lots of lines throughout volumes 1, 2 and 3; likely does not return afterwards
- 41 lines in the first 5 levels.

Larger and smarter than most cyclopes, Gargarensis quickly grew to become a natural leader among his tribe. Rather than hunt down humans to eat them, he spied on them, paying attention to their advanced technology and farming techniques. Through his observations, his tribe became the first of all cyclops tribes to grow their own food.

Believing there was more to learn from the humans, Gargarensis introduced himself to them, hoping to join their society. Although hostile at first, the humans found that Gargarensis and the other cyclopes could help protect them from neighboring villages and city states.
