Activity/Outline:

- Try a Duet
 - Look through the book or online and find a duet piece.
 - Record yourself playing one of the parts.
 - If able, record part one and two by using an overlay program like BandLab
 - If able, send recordings of duets attached to classroom
 - Write a brief reflection on how this experience went and how it could be useful during this time.

 - Give yourself a time limit to how long you can look at it before playing
 - Challenge yourself
 - Record yourself on runthrough and give feedback
 - Bump up the difficulty
 - Try a new key signature
- Theory Work: Minor Triads
 - We've practiced Major triads and now it's on to Minor
 - Students will complete the worksheet to the best of their ability
 - Minor triads are the reverse of Major
 - From each note: Root- m3- M3
 - From root: Root- m3- P5
