Sean Lebita, originally from Lincoln, NE, graduated from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 2022 with a BM in Piano Performance and studied under Dr. Paul Barnes. He is currently the accompanist for Lincoln Northeast High School. While at UNL, Sean performed with the UNL Jazz Orchestra, Graduate Jazz Combo, various chamber ensembles, and was in demand as an accompanist. In 2018, he won the Nebraska MTNA Young Artist competition for piano. He was also awarded the Glenn Korff School of Music Distinguished Undergraduate Artist/Scholar award in

2021. Sean's diverse set of skills allow him to be a classical and jazz pianist, accompanist, and chamber musician. He frequently performs solo and with ensembles in the Lincoln-Omaha area, including with his jazz trio, the Prism Trio. He is also an active church musician, playing for services at various parishes. Sean is a member of the Lincoln Music Teachers Association and teaches with their Music Outreach Program. He also collaborates with fellow pianists while teaching and performing online.
