Welcome to Global Business Brigades (GBB)! The intent of this document is to provide a structure for pre-brigade preparation with your campus chapter. GBB will provide materials where appropriate, but there is significant material available on the topics covered on a business brigade, and we have provided links to outside resources that may prove useful. Ultimately, the chapter president will be responsible for organizing meetings, teaching fellow chapter members, and distributing further information.

Students will be working in two different types of communities, those who have working savings and loans cooperatives (co-ops), and those who are still taking first steps to form a co-op. This education and training plan will help prepare student brigades for both situations, as they may likely encounter individuals and questions about both topics, no matter the community's current situation.
