Did a couple of these touch a nerve? If not, wonderful, if so, let's repent ourselves and change.

Elder Renlund then said...the blessings that await us as children of a loving and giving Heavenly Father are remarkable and bountiful.

Let's believe this teaching and really turn our focus on those we are called to serve AND THOSE WE SERVE WITH.

We add our promise that as we forget ourselves and our own needs and wants and move our full attention to others, our entire perspective will in fact change. Opportunities to teach and testify will increase. Those with whom we interact each day will be drawn to our sincere concern and everyone involved...including you, will receive the blessings that He is anxiously waiting to give.
