1 - Who are Minga Teachers?

2 - How many years of teaching experience do I need?

For this process with all the sponsors, it is necessary to have more than 2 years of teaching experience, of which you need to have been teaching in the last 5 years.

3 - Can I apply without having the experience?

Yes, but your application will be put on hold until you meet the requirements.

4 - Why is my teaching experience before graduating not valid?

In the United States, teaching without your diploma is not valid, so the experience you might have without your degree is not valid.

5 - What is the link to apply?

Apply here

6 - How do I start the process?

Enter the link that was sent to you, complete your personal, family, and work section in your profile, and then in the Documentation section, attach the documents requested.

7 - What documents do I need?

To start, it is important to fill out your personal, family, and work information. Then, as an initial step, it is important to upload: your diploma, passport scanned with all pages, grades, and also translations of your diploma and grades.

8 - How much do they charge?

Minga Teacher and EPI do not have any application fees.

9 - What money do I need to invest?

You need to invest in your documents, translations, and visa.

10 - Do they help me locate in the USA?

EPI has people in charge of helping you with your accommodation when you are in the USA.

11 - Is my driver's license necessary for the process?

Yes, as schools in the USA are not nearby, it is necessary that you have your own transportation in order to go by yourself to the institution. EPI helps you with the process so that you can rent or buy a vehicle in installments.

12 - Can I travel with my family?

Yes, your partner can travel with you as long as you are married, and you can bring your legitimate or legally adopted children. Applicants bear the expenses of their families.

13 - Is an English level certificate needed?

No, they will assess your English level during the interviews.

14 - When would I travel?

Hiring takes place approximately from June to August each year.

15 - How long does the process take?

If you have all the necessary information and documentation, the selection process can take from 15 to 20 days.

16 - How long is the contract for?

It depends on the institution and your performance; it can be for 1, 2, or 3 years.

17 - Is there an age limit?

No.

18 - What is the timeline for applying?

Application processes are open all year round; you can apply at any time.

19 - What if I have US nationality?

You cannot apply since it is an exchange program.

20 - Does it affect me if I have a tourist visa?

No, on the contrary, this can help your work visa to have more chances of being approved.

21 - What if I have visas denied?

The EPI legal team recommends applying for a tourist visa separately since trying with a J visa is very likely to be denied. However, you can continue with the application process.

22 - Where do I register?

23 - Can I register with my partner?

Yes, if you both are teachers and you want to be considered for the same process, it is necessary that you are married.

24 -Which document do I have to pay for?

Initially, you only need to pay for the translation of your transcripts to be considered for a first interview.

25 - Do I have to pay for my visa?

Only the appointment at the embassy has a cost, approximately \$150.

26 - Why is it necessary for me to be working to apply?

It's a process requirement.

27 - How much is the salary?

It depends on the state, level of education, and experience; you can see an example here: Salaries

28 - I don't have my diploma, I only have my graduation certificates, can I apply with them?

No, you need to have your diploma and complete the process with your university.

29 - Document name and page to download the criminal record:

The page to see your criminal records in Colombia is <u>Criminal Backgrowndcheck</u>, and to download the document, you can follow the instructions in the following video <u>How to download</u>

30 - What is the School Proof of Employment?

It's proof of employment from the institution where you have been and where you are currently working, to verify that you have the required experience for the program. Acceptable documents include a letter from your school's principal on official letterhead or a letter from the Ministry or Department of Education.

32 - Second Interview - Teacher Evaluation Interview

Your 20-second responses will be recorded during the interview and used as your introduction videos for the schools.

33 - Additional areas for discussion during your second interview might include the following:

Tips:

- The answers are brief and to the point.
- Answers to the questions are 20 seconds each.
- Be energetic and passionate with your answers.
- Practice before your video resume capture session
- Dress professionally

Question 1: Choose and prepare for a character question

- As a teacher, what is most successful in the classroom?
- How would becoming a Cultural Ambassador benefit you as a teacher?
- Why is it important to be a teacher in today's society?

Question 2: Choose and prepare for 1 professional question

- Give an example of how you keep your students motivated to learn.
- Select one of the following: establishing rapport with students, classroom organization, and content knowledge; What is most important and why?
- What tools do you use to achieve successful classroom management?
- Why is it so important to implement technology in teaching?

Additional areas for discussion during your second interview might include the following:

Why do you want to come to the USA?
What do you include in a lesson plan?
What strategies do you use with a student displaying disruptive behavior?
How do you proactively manage behavior in the classroom?
What kind of rapport do you maintain with students' parents?

34 - What are HOME-TIES and which ones are useful for me?

Home-Ties is a kind of documentation that they ask you to support the J-1 (temporary worker) VISA process to verify that you have ties to your country. Since the initial VISA is only temporary for three years, it is important to document that you have a professional and stable life in your country so that you are not seen as a risk if you stay in the United States illegally. Demonstrating that you have an established and good life to which you would return helps you more easily be approved for the United States J-1 VISA as a cultural exchange teacher. The documents that help in this process are the following; The more you have, the better!: (no translation necessary)

It's not that you have to hand over all these documents, no. You only share what you have with them. When you upload the ones that exist, email to EPI, telling them "I have no more home-ties, please process my application." If you don't write an email with those words, it is possible that they accidentally continue your incomplete profile waiting for you to send them more documents. Then you have to send the email to close the process. Upload what you have and upload it quickly so your profile can be processed! team@teachwithepi.com

Proof of Property (house, apartment, farm, lot)
Vehicle Registrations (motorcycle, car)
Life insurance
Pensions, severance pay
Business / Company
Retirement plan

Return to work letter (letter stating that an institution will give you a contract again upon completion of the program in the USA) - it is not required, most teachers do not achieve this, it's ok.

Suggestion: Additional Documents / Processes / Factors that, although they are not Home-Ties, nor are they required, but we recommend them because we know they are useful, they will help you document stability and be a more competitive teacher.

Driver's license (giving more mobility and independence)

More credit cards (for use on your trip, and in emergencies)

Savings in your bank account! Having a minimum of 3000 USD in the bank would be ideal to ensure that you can pay for your housing, food, transportation, and expenses during the first month that you are waiting for your first payroll payment. Make sense?

35 - What is Credential Evaluation?

It is an evaluation that they do to your studies to analyze what your education in the USA is equivalent to. After passing your second internal interview (Teacher Evaluation Interview), EPI will send you an email asking you to choose one of these recommended agencies to do your Credential Evaluation: The cost of this process will be compensated by the school that hires you in the United States.

42- Steps to request the appointment at the embassy and emergency appointment.

1. Complete the DS-160 Form

Go to the U.S. Department of State website and fill out the DS-160 form. After submitting it, print the confirmation page with the barcode.

2. Create an Account on the Visa Appointment Portal

Visit https://ais.usvisa-info.com and create an account for your country.

3. Pay the Visa Application Fee

Pay the MRV fee (usually \$185 USD) through one of the accepted methods listed on the portal. Save the receipt.

4. Schedule a Regular Appointment

Book the next available standard appointment through the portal — this is a required step before requesting an emergency slot.

5. Request an Emergency Appointment

Once your regular appointment is confirmed, log into your account and select the "Emergency Request" option. Complete the form explaining your reason for the urgent appointment.

6. Wait for Approval

The U.S. Embassy or Consulate will review your request and notify you via email, typically within 72 business hours.

Required Documentation

You'll need:

- Valid passport (at least 6 months beyond your intended stay)
- DS-160 confirmation page
- MRV fee payment receipt
- Confirmation of your scheduled regular appointment
- Recent passport photo (2x2 inches)

Depending on your emergency reason, you must also provide:

- **Medical emergency**: Doctor's letter and hospital documents
- Funeral or death: Death certificate and proof of relationship
- **Urgent business travel**: Letter from your employer or U.S. counterpart
- Academic or exchange program: Acceptance or invitation letter

TIPS

- There is no extra cost for the emergency request only the standard visa fee is required.
- If approved, you'll receive a new appointment date.
- Be honest and detailed in your explanation; false or vague claims may lead to denial.

42.2- What is a SEVIS identification number?

SEVIS is short for "Information System for Students and Exchange Visitors". SEVIS is the web-based system used by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to maintain information about J-1 Visa Exchange Visitor Program participants and their J-2 dependents coming to the U.S. for cultural and educational exchange programs. Each person seeking a J Visa has a unique identifier assigned to them through SEVIS. This identifier is known as the SEVIS identification number.

42.3- What is a DS-2019 form?

A DS-2019 form is a document controlled by the U.S. Department of State that can only be produced through SEVIS. A DS-2019 form is the basic document required to support an exchange visitor J visa application.

Form DS-2019 is also known as the Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor Status.

EPI issues its Form DS-2019 after completing the Visa Assessment Questionnaire in the previous course, "Preparing for Visa Application." Each DS-2019 form is a 2-page document and contains the Exchange Visitor participant's unique SEVIS identification number. Here is an example of a DS-2019 form for a J-1 visa applicant:

Form DS-2019 lists the details of your program sponsorship, including:

- Block 1 Who you are
- Block 2 A brief description of the program activity in which you will participate
- Block 3: The start and end dates of your program
- Block 4 The category of the program
- Block 7 Information and authorization of your sponsor
