1. Sherrie Drost Chacon updated committee on Peak's Action Plan
 - a. Goal 1 Industry Certification
 - i. Adobe-1st round complete
 - ii. Riverwatch elective starts Tri 3
 - iii. Hydrology elective for 2024
 - b. Goal 2 Staff Training
 - i. New staff has been trained on current platforms
 - ii. Peak purchased a school Nearpod account-Sherrie explained how the platform functions to increase understanding and interactivity for our students
 - iii. P/T online SPED teacher has been through most training
 - c. Goal 3 MTSS
 - i. New MTSS facilitator has been through training
 - ii. Elementary teachers and instructional para have been trained in Orton Gillingham phonics
 - iii. Weekly meetings include student progress and lesson planning
 - iv. Documentation of intervention in EdPlan
2. Enrollment numbers discussed, quite a few more students since updates were written, Tri 2 started the week before break and we have had about 10 more applicants, we have 25 seniors

3. Activities to support re-engagement through ESSER funding includes all-school Corn Maze field trip, Middle School Camp Cedaredge, High School Bowling, Senior trip to Bananas and High School 10-12th grade trip to CMU and weekly Book Mobile
4. STEM projects were discussed
 - a. Trout in the classroom collaboration with Outer Range
 - b. GIS elective Tri3
 - c. Riverwatch elective Tri3
 - d. Trust test FAA (drone pilot certification)
 - e. Other: Otter Pond, Greenhouse repairs, Underwater ROV upgrades,
 - f. Elementary STEM activities ongoing
 - g. Peak participated in Manufacturer's Expo highlighting all of our projects
5. Holiday Projects/Activities
 - a. Students raising money for toys for in-need Northside and Pomona students
 - b. Middle School Movie December 16
 - c. Elementary Read-alouds
 - d. All Peak students received winter hats with grant funds
6. Evaluation of Online Secondary Program
 - a. Formula change-students need 5 courses each trimester for full time funding
 - b. Designing a 6-8 session required course to support students with anxiety starting with middle school students, Joey suggested some helpful resources that they employ at Peer Kindness
7. UIP was presented by Sherrie, data shows that Peak students' performance met or exceeded the standards for the district, state and nationally
 - a. NWA/Dibels testing begins for mid year data, will be shared in January
8. We discussed the need for a crosswalk at 6th and Park. Joey and Sherrie will contact the city to understand the next steps
9. Laura raised concerns that there are some Montrose scholarships that are not available to Peak students. Brigitte will investigate this further
10. We discussed some possibilities for student lunch at Peak. Will explore the possibility of sack lunch drop off or of a food delivery model like Mesa County 'Lunch Lizard' food truck.
