

Senior Honors Night FAQ

Congratulations to our seniors on their accomplishments! We are very excited to recognize many of them at Senior Honors Night on Monday, May 11th in the Performing Arts Center (PAC) at Lake Zurich High School at 7:00pm. Below are the answers to some frequently asked questions about this event.

Which seniors attend Senior Honors Night?

- Students will receive an email invitation closer to the event to let them know if they will be earning an Individual Award, Group Award, or Both an Individual and Group Award. The students who receive this email are invited to attend Senior Honors Night.

How do students earn an Individual Award?

- These awards are often a surprise! Students can be awarded an Individual Award through one of our school's divisions and/ or by earning a community scholarship through the high school.
- Students who earn an Individual Award will walk up to the front of the stage when their name is read aloud.

What are the Group Awards and what does each award receive?

- For Group Awards, students will stand at their seat on the stage to be recognized. No individual names will be read aloud for Group Awards, but students' names will appear on the slideshow.
- Here are the Group Awards recognized:
 - Illinois State Scholar- Certificate
 - North Suburban Conference- Certificate
 - Tri-M National Music Honor Society- Cords
 - National Honor Society- Cords
 - Technical Campus Recognition Award- Certificate
 - Academic Excellence (Summa Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, Cum Laude)- Medal

Who can attend Senior Honors Night? Where does everyone sit?

- Students are allowed to bring guests (parents, guardians, family members, etc.) to Senior Honors Night. Students will sit on the stage and their guests will sit in the seats in the audience.

Is there a Dress Code?

- Appropriate dress will be required for students not arriving directly from participation in a school athletic event. Ties, dresses, slacks, and other more formal dress is requested.
