Reading -

Possible Short stories: Thank You, Ma'am, Seventh Grade, The Monkey's Paw, The Third Wish Harrison Bergeron, Seventh Grade, Examination Day. Incorporate Notice and Note Signposts as a reading strategy; plenty of note taking on plot

- Literary Focus with all our reading for first MP- point of view, mood, tone, how setting impacts plot, all plot elements, indirect characterization, theme, objective summary writing
- Narrative (writing) Since we learn about plot, we will be writing about our memories or imagined stories narratively. The focus is on personal voice, learning a lesson, and using setting and dialogue to move the narrative along. During this writing unit, I will focus on syntax and comma usage as the main focus of grammar instruction. We will also rewrite the ending of one of the short stories.
- Grammar Focus: dashes, hyphens, semi colons, and colons. Focus on writing compound and complex sentences

8th-

Reading -

Short stories: The Diamond Necklace, The Most Dangerous Game, The Interlopers, Lamb to the Slaughter, The Landlady, the Elevator, The Tell-Tale Heart, The Raven (narrative poem), Fish Cheeks, the Veldt, A Sound of Thunder, The Lottery. Incorporate Signposts as reading strategy

- Literary Focus with all our reading for first MP- point of view, mood, tone, how setting impacts plot, all plot elements, indirect characterization, theme, writing an objective summary, how dialogue and setting impacts PLOT and ties to THEME
- Narrative (writing) Since we review plot and narratives, we will focus on personal voice, learning a
 lesson, and using setting and dialogue to move writing of a narrative along. During this writing unit,
 I will focus on syntax and comma usage as the main focus of grammar instruction. We will also
 rewrite the ending of one of the short stories if time permits.
