Project Component	Points	Criteria
Author Introduction	5 pts.	<ul> <li>Make a video to talk to your audiences about who you are and your rationale for choosing this topic.</li> <li>Make connection to your About Me page or other personal contact information.</li> </ul>
Inquire – the ESSENTIAL Question	20 pts.	<ul> <li>Write the question(s) that will be investigated (The question is an authentic/ real-world/ complex problem).</li> <li>What subject(s) will be covered in this adventure.</li> <li>Why is it important to learn more about this problem?</li> <li>Students should know what the adventure is about based on this question.</li> </ul>
Standards	5 pts.	<ul> <li>List the Georgia Performance Standards that this project meets or that students will master after completing the adventure.</li> <li>List the standards adopted from NETS (creativity, critical thinking, communication and collaboration).</li> <li>List the standards from the 21st century Partnership Skills (4 cs, media literacy).</li> </ul>
Hook – Anticipatory Set	10 pts.	<ul> <li>Give some facts, interesting websites, additional questions, etc. – this is considered the anticipatory set – the part of the adventure where you get students excited about and engaged in exploring more about the question.</li> <li>You might include an appropriate online game or activity related to your question – don't just provide a link – give students something specific to do.</li> <li>If appropriate for your topic – create a small gallery of photos that fit the question. But give students something to do with the pictures – or encourage them to create a photo album of their own pictures related to the question.</li> <li>You might want to make a short video clip about the topic/ question.</li> <li>Describe students' prior knowledge related to the topic/ question.</li> <li>Terminology that will help students learn about the topic/ question.</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Don't just list the items. Give descriptions.</li> <li>You need to have at least TWO items for this section.</li> </ul>
i+1 Zone– connect students' prior knowledge with the new content (scaffolding)  LDT (Learning, Design and Technology)	25 pts.	<ul> <li>Use graphic organizer software to create a printable for children to organize information – this could be a KWL chart, a cause and effect chart, etc. It is best if it becomes a tool to help them navigate through all of the parts of the adventure – so they know where to go and what to do in each section.</li> <li>Lectures materials you prepared – a website, PPT/ Prezi presentation.</li> <li>List of reading materials (at least 5 items, it can be a book, a blog post, a news, a video on YouTube).</li> <li>Study Guides.</li> <li>Classroom activities – You need to develop at least ONE activities.         <ul> <li>You use this technology tool to design something to engage your students – augmented reality, geocatching, QR code activities, Google map, app, website construction (webquest)etc. (you need my approval for this technology choice)</li> <li>Discussion activity</li> <li>Hands-on activity</li> <li>Role play, interview, debates, games, worksheetsetc.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Show What You Know Student Product	15 pts.	<ul> <li>This is the product – after they've learned about the topic, what can children create to show what they've learned and/or to learn more about the topic? This will be a creative endeavor.</li> <li>How will students share their final product with you? Mail it, email a picture, etc. – you will decide what they send to you in order to earn their certificate.</li> <li>It can be a worksheet, a test, a journal, an essayetc.</li> <li>You don't need to make a sample of the product, but you need to develop the detailed description of it.</li> </ul>
Product/ Presentation Affordance	5 pts.	<ul> <li>The creativeness shown in the adventure.</li> <li>The formality shown in the adventure.</li> </ul>
Presentation	15 pts.	<ul> <li>This will consist of a 10-minute FORMAL presentation. You will be evaluated by your attitude toward the presentation including your outfit, teamwork, use of words</li> </ul>
