ABSTRACT

Structured abstract, (up to 250 words) is required for original research papers and review articles

unstructured abstract less than 150 words for case report

Structured abstract: should include: **Background, Purpose of your work (Aim), Methods, key Results and main Conclusions. Do not use any non-standard or unusual abbreviations.**

Keywords: submit 3 to 5 indexing keywords

NOTE: References cited in text are in square brackets BEFORE the closing punctuation, e.g. [1, 2, 3] and figures/tables are in parenthesis, e.g. (Figure 1) or (Table 1) after the punctuation

INTRODUCTION

[Type or copy/paste your text here]

is a brief explanation of the problem outlined in the manuscript and aim of the study. One should state only the references that are directly related to a problem introduced in the manuscript. Keep the chain of reasoning and end the part with a brief statement of the purpose of the research.

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MATERIALS, PATIENTS and METHODS

[Type or copy/paste your text here]

Materials, patients and Methods (three subheadings): Basic procedures and selection of study subjects or laboratory animals, observation and analysis methods should be succinctly and methodically stated (Patients/Materials and study design, Methods, Statistical analysis). Do not list common/irrelevant methods (use a reference instead). The key information on the patient traits should be presented here and not under the result section.

Statistical Analysis: Statistical analysis details and their correctness are an integral component of the Materials and Methods section. Authors should list all applied statistical methods and all used statistical tests. They are encouraged to report all statistical methods clearly, including effect sizes with confidence intervals, the name and version of the software used. Statistical significance (*P*-value) accepted in research should be specified. For example, it could be stated as follows: The significance level was set at 0.05. The *P* value should be specified in each case (e.g, not simply $P < 0.05$ or $P > 0.05$ but $P = 0.015$ or $P = 0.271$).

TABLES: Tables must be placed in their correct place within the text (not to be put on separate pages). Number all tables consecutively. Tables should be mentioned in the text. The number of the table is positioned above the table title. Table numbers must match table numbers in the text and should be statistically processed.

Abbreviations: List all abbreviations in the table and specify significance

FIGURES

must be placed in their correct place within the text (not to be put on separate pages). Number all figures consecutively. TIFF or JPG files of color line drawings are accepted; the resolution of the image must be 300 dpi. Compression can be LZW or other. Each figure should be of high quality with a title and a caption. In figures, the abbreviations must be explained in the caption.

FUNDING:

Authors have to state any source of funds, i.e. information about any funding sources or professional assistance to write a work, as follows: "This work was supported by.....' with the complete official name of the funding agency and its reference number. When no particular funding has been obtained, then this should also be made clear: Funding: No particular funding was obtained to conduct this study.

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Authors should report any conflict of interest with a company or an organisation in the manuscript. There should be a declaration of any competing interests, circumstances or relationships. Personal relationships can be considered in

conflicts of interest (i.e. friend, spouse, family member, current or former mentor, adversary, etc.). Provided that the authors feel they have nothing to reveal they still need to include a statement.

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Contributions should be listed in a standardized format, DO NOT mention the author names as this will breach the anonymity of the reviewing process, instead write: (“1st and 2nd authors designed the study; 1st, 2nd and 3rd authors collected and analysed the data; drafted the manuscript and provided critical revisions”).
