Good Neighbor | Meet some Neighbors

Discussion Guide

God does not give His work only to special "super-Christians"; He has good work prepared in advance for each of us. Our goal is not to "go out" on a mission, but to "go about" on a mission - to live everyday as citizens of God's kingdom engaged in Kingdom work. When we learn to truly accept and receive God's love, and seek to love Jesus in return, then we will become more like Him, and we will engage in His work with who we are and where we are. Ask God to anoint you to see the people He has placed in front of you with the same love that He sees them, and to guide you as you go about in His mission.

- 6. Who has encouraged you in your journey? Who inspires you to be more like Christ?
- 7. How can we encourage you in the next step of your journey?
