## Dear {FIRST NAME},

Some of us are feeling unsettled. We are seeing much antisemitic activity and even more rhetoric.

Mobs, real or virtual, create chaos. Chaos breeds confusion. When there is confusion innocent people get hurt.

You may be feeling threatened by this mob. You may be confused in this chaos. So let's pause for a moment of clarity.

Let's take a moment to remember to be proud Jews.

Proud that Judaism introduced the world to many of its basic human rights.

Proud that Jews were and continue to be at the forefront of advocating for the oppressed.

Proud that Judaism hasn't blurred the lines of right and wrong, and has maintained its integrity to think clearly rather than run with the loudest mob.

Don't be intimidated by the mob or confused by the chaos. Take a deep breath, tap into our millennia-old wisdom and strength, and stand proud of your value-rich identity. Continue to live by and advocate for our cherished values of truth, kindness, morality, equality, security, and peace.

Wear your Kipah or another Jewish symbol proudly so people know this wonderful mentch they encounter is a product of Judaism. Hang your Mezuza on your doorpost to emphasize the basic human need to be secure and that G-d is the ultimate guardian.
