The majority of financial aid for college comes from the government and the colleges directly so it's REALLY important you complete the FAFSA (which opens Dec 1st) and search the colleges' websites. Each college's financial aid office determines federal, State, and College-based grants.

BOETTCHER SCHOLARSHIP

A competitive, merit-based, four-year scholarship for any individual attending a Colorado institution of higher education. More information is available [HERE](#).

Application is open [HERE](#) until November 1, 2024 at 5:00 pm MST.

To be considered for the Boettcher Scholarship, you must meet these minimum requirements:

- Be a graduating Colorado high school senior who has lived in Colorado for your full junior and senior years of high school;
- Apply during the Fall of your final high school year, even if you are graduating early or considering taking a gap year after graduation;
- Graduate from a Colorado high school;
- Be a citizen, legal permanent resident, or lawfully present (including DACA) in the United States

Selection criteria include:

- Superior scholastic ability and intellectual curiosity
- Evidence of leadership and involvement

- Service to community and school
- Outstanding character

Typically, competitive applicants rank in the top 5% of their classes and earn a minimum SAT score of 1388 or ACT score of 32, although test scores are not required for the current application year.

Round 1: Application is open [HERE](#) from September 1 until December 1, 2024 at 12:00 pm MST. The first round of the application consists of collecting eligibility and demographic information, as well as a short answer response. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

Round 2: If approved, you will be invited to Round 2, which opens on September 15, 2024 and closes on December 1, 2024. The second round requires you to submit your transcript, test scores (with exception), additional demographic information, two letters of recommendation, your FAFSA Student Aid Report, short answer responses, and an essay response. Semi-finalists will be notified in early January 2025 and will be invited to create and submit a short video response (Round 3).

Round 3: Semi-finalists will be invited to create and submit a short video response. Submissions are simple and a cellphone video or video from your laptop will be sufficient; no video editing is required. Deadline for video submission is January 26, 2025
Finalists will be notified in early March 2025

Round 4: Finalists will be invited to submit updated transcripts, test scores (optional), a headshot, college acceptance status, other scholarship awards statuses, and to schedule an interview. Interviews will be held in-person within each applicant's home state the weeks of March 31 - April 15, 2025.

DEADLINE (submission & scheduling): March 17, 2025

Scholars will be notified by email and phone the week of April 30, 2024

To be considered for the Greenhouse Scholarship, you must meet these minimum requirements:

- Be a graduating high school senior planning to attend a four-year accredited academic institution
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident and a legal resident of Colorado, Georgia, Illinois, New York, or North Carolina.
- Have a cumulative, unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above
- Demonstrate financial need (annual household income no greater than \$70,000)
- Possess excellent leadership skills, an ability to persevere through difficult circumstances, and a strong interest in and commitment to their community

BIG FUTURE SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship Value: \$40,000

Awards Available: 24

Award Deadline: Nov 30, 2024

The Scholarship Program is open to seniors in high school who meet the eligibility requirements. If you are an eligible student, by completing a college planning step using your College Board account, you will automatically earn a chance to win a \$500 scholarship and an additional chance to win a \$40,000 scholarship.

There are no essay, minimum GPA, test score, or citizenship requirements. It's easy to enter scholarship drawings each month. Simply complete one of the steps before the deadline, and you'll be automatically entered to win \$40,000.

To be eligible for the Big Future Scholarship you:

Must attend a public, private, or home school, located in one of the fifty (50) United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Northern Mariana Islands, or any other U.S. territories and possessions, or are U.S. Citizens or residents who attend a U.S. Department of Defense Education Activity ("DoDEA") school outside of the United States and U.S. territories.

WHITE ROSE SCHOLARSHIP

White Rose is an outreach program of the Rocky Mountain Court System and the Imperial Court of The Rocky Mountain Empire; a gay, lesbian, transgender social service organization founded in 1973 in Denver, Colorado. Since inception, White Rose has awarded over \$340,000 in scholarships to a "rainbow" of people to assist in furthering their education. The White Rose Scholarship Foundation in no way discriminates against anyone on the basis of race, religion, creed, national origin, age, gender, or sexual orientation

Scholarship eligibility requirements:

- Citizenship: Must be a United States citizen OR permanent resident of the United States AND a resident of the State of Colorado for the past year (365 days). (Permanent residents, attach a copy of your residency card).

- Demonstrate financial need: Please submit the first 2 pages of your PREVIOUS YEAR'S federal personal and/or your parent's tax return.
- Community Service: The WRSF is a community service based scholarship; the applicant must be involved in one or more community service activities, (i.e. school, church, civic, LGBT, etc.).
- Post-Secondary Education: Must be either applying to, admitted and enrolled, or attending an institution of higher learning or an accredited technical or vocational school.
- GPA: Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0, or GED equivalent. (Evidenced by high school and/or college transcript).

PINNACOL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

We know that when a parent is seriously injured in an accident, life suddenly becomes a lot harder for the whole family. That's why we created our scholarship program — to ensure that despite things beyond your control, you still have an opportunity to pursue your academic goals.

Pinnacol Foundation scholarships may be used for four-year, two-year or trade programs at accredited colleges, universities, community colleges and vocational schools. They average \$4,700 per student per year, and may only be used for the costs of attending school.

Applicants must:

- Be the child of a worker who was injured or killed in a compensable work-related accident in Colorado and who was entitled to benefits under the Colorado Workers' Compensation Act. It does not matter which insurance company covered the accident.
- Be between the ages of 16 and 25 at the time of the application deadline.
- Have and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Have a high school diploma or GED or be a high school senior.

Scholarships average \$4,700 per student per year and may be used to attend four-year, two-year or trade programs at accredited colleges, universities, community colleges and vocational schools. Students are eligible whether or not Pinnacol Assurance covered the parent's claim.

JOSEPH JAMES MORELLI FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants must be (1) either a high school student or a post-high school student, (2) who will be attending an accredited undergraduate school, technical school, or community college in the United States in the Fall of 2025. Graduate students are not eligible. Applicants must be pursuing a degree in STEM field (science, technology, engineering, math) and must have a demonstrated learning challenge (disability) of dyslexia or similar reading and/or language-based disability .

Our scholarship application process is online utilizing the SM Apply program.

Resources required for completing the application:

- Personal email address (not a school email address)
- Recommendation letter from a teacher, counselor, other school personnel, or reading specialist, who knows you well and can speak to your challenges and successes relative to your learning challenge. (If someone needs to upload the letter of recommendation on your behalf, be sure to allow enough time for that.)
- Documentation of your learning challenge such as a 504, IEP or one-page letter from a teacher or counselor
- Most recent transcript, official or unofficial

- March 2, 2025 – application closes at 11:59 pm Mountain Time.
- May 31, 2025 – scholarship awards are announced
- Summer 2025 – scholarships are paid out

Who can apply

- Cumulative 3.0 GPA required
- Former BCHA scholarship recipient who desires to continue their human health care education. (Section A, C if applicable) Scholarships awarded maximum of 4 times.

- Graduating high school senior attending a public or private school within the boundaries of Boulder Valley School District RE-2, who has been accepted as a full-time student by an accredited Colorado Institution. (Sections A and B)
- Graduating high school senior who has been accepted as a full-time student by an accredited Colorado Institution and is a child of a current BCH employee. The school district is whichever district the BCH employee resides. (Sections A and B)
- Currently active BCH volunteer or current Junior BCH Volunteer (graduating high school senior living outside Boulder Valley School District RE-2), who has completed a minimum of 150 BCH volunteer hours as of February 24, 2023 & has been accepted as a full-time student or presently enrolled at an accredited Colorado Institution. (Section A, B & C if applicable)
- Current employee of BCH with 2 years of full-time or half-time (18-35 hrs/week) employment at BCH as of February 24, 2025, and has been accepted at an accredited Colorado Institution or accredited online institution. Continuing education classes are excluded. (Sections A and C)

Scholarship Selection

Required Packet Content - submit all together

- Transcript from most recent academic year (unofficial transcripts will be accepted, however we may request an official transcript after initial review of your application).
- Two letters of recommendation from non-family members. Letters must be written and dated on or after September 2022. Letters must contain the phone number and email address of the person writing the recommendation. Letter of recommendations can be sent directly to info@bchambassadors.org by the author of the letter or attached to this application.
- A one-page essay only (may be double-spaced). Please title your essay.

First-Time Applicants address the following question: “How did you arrive at your decision to pursue an education/advanced degree in health care and how will this scholarship help you meet your goals?”

All Other Applicants address the following question: “Describe any volunteer experience you have had that was not required of you. Tell the committee why you chose that particular experience, what you learned in the process, and how it changed you.

ELIGIBILITY

- A permanent resident of Colorado living within the geographic boundaries of Rotary District 5450. Basically this is metro Denver, from Summit CO to the Eastern Plains and from Longmont to Castle Rock.
- A United States citizen of good character.
- In possession of a strong academic record and aptitude for post secondary study as evidenced by one's GPA, college entrance examination scores, written recommendations from one's secondary counselor or high school administrator and a teacher from within

the physical sciences or mathematics disciplines, each of whom possesses knowledge of the applicant's achievement and potential.

- Accepted to a collegiate institution within the state of Colorado.
- Willing to attend at least four meetings of the University Hills-Denver Rotary Club per year and report on progress toward their goals, as well as maintaining regular communication with a club appointed counselor.

OPTIONAL APPLICATION INCLUSION

An applicant may add an additional letter of recommendation from a person who has been closely associated with the applicant in a work, volunteer, or school related activity or experience in which the participation required one to exhibit knowledge and skills related to a scientific or mathematical endeavor.

PRIORITIES

Priority may be given to sons or daughters of current active duty military personnel, former military personnel who suffered a disability related to their military service, and/or to applicants themselves who are undergoing rehabilitative treatment for physical injuries.

Financial need will be given weight in considering the application.

SUBMISSION

NEVER FORGOTTEN SCHOLARSHIP

The Never Forgotten Fund was established in 2001 by iHeartMedia, Inc. (formerly Clear Channel) at The Denver Foundation to honor the lives of the 13 victims at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. Twelve students and one teacher died that day. The contributions they would have made to the world were lost as well. It is hoped that the recipients of this scholarship will carry on the legacy of these individuals by making a positive and lasting impact in the world.

Eligibility

- Be graduating from a Denver Metropolitan area high school during the current academic year
- Be a U.S. citizen or a permanent legal resident
- Have a cumulative G.P.A. (unweighted) of at least a 3.0
- Have a strong record of school and community involvement
- Be planning to attend an accredited college or university full-time for the upcoming academic year

Selection

Scholarships will be awarded once a year through a competitive process based on:

- their commitment to community service
- engagement in their school and/or larger communities
- demonstrated leadership skills

Additional information

Each year 12 graduating high school seniors and one teacher are selected to receive a \$5,000 scholarship award. At least two scholarships will be awarded to students attending Columbine High School, Littleton Colorado.

Scholarship awards are a one-time award that will be paid directly to a recipient's school and can be used toward tuition, fees, books, and other required educational expenses for study at an accredited college or university. Awards are not renewable and must be used for the upcoming academic year. Award disbursement is contingent upon the outside scholarship acceptance policies of a recipient's college or university.

How to apply

1. Read through the eligibility to confirm you meet the requirements for the scholarship opportunity
2. Prepare and submit the following items:
 - a. Resume
 - b. Transcript
 - c. Two essays
 - i. Think about a recent news event within the past year and discuss the following
 - a. How has hearing about this event positively impacted and changed your life?
 - b. Share 2-3 examples of how it has prompted you to take action and positively contribute to your school and/or larger community
 - ii. If selected to receive a scholarship, how do you plan to use the award? How will it impact your professional career?
 - iii. Please describe what you would like to study in college, what inspired your interest in this area, and what you hope to achieve with this degree.
 - d. One academic reference

The Hagan Scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship, providing recipients with the opportunity to achieve their goals and graduate college debt-free. The Hagan Scholarship provides up to \$7,500 each semester for up to 8 consecutive semesters, workshops to learn important life skills not typically covered in the college curriculum, funds to purchase college essentials, an HSF Schwab Brokerage Account to manage, funds to study and travel abroad, and the opportunity to extend the Hagan Scholarship to obtain a graduate or professional degree.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Must be a U.S. Citizen or have a Permanent Resident Card (Green Card).
2. Must attend a high school located in the United States. Can be a public, private, charter, magnet, or STEM school.
3. Must be in the high school graduating class.
4. Must have achieved a 3.50 Cumulative Grade Point Average.
5. Must enroll in an eligible four-year not-for-profit College or University the first semester following high school graduation.
6. Must maintain a four year or less graduation schedule in college, or complete the equivalent of a four year degree if in a professional program.

7. Recipients must work 240 hours from January 1, 2025 until September 1, 2025. Work can be performed at recipient discretion. Employment must be regularly scheduled work performed under supervision for compensation. Work can be full-time during the summer and/or part-time work.
8. Applicant's Adjusted Gross Household Income reported for 2023 Federal Income Tax Purposes must not have exceeded \$100,000. "Household Income" is defined as the total income received by all members of a household living under the same roof.
9. Applicants selected as Finalists must provide a copy of their FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS).
10. Must apply for Federal and State grants if eligible.
11. Must not have a felony conviction.

Application Overview

The UNCF STEM Scholars Program is an initiative designed to identify and provide scholarship and academic support for African American, Hispanic American, Asian Pacific Islander American, American Indian and Alaskan Native high school students who aspire to earn STEM degrees and to pursue careers in STEM fields. The program awards 100 scholarships on an annual basis.

The program enables highly capable young people to pursue undergraduate STEM majors and prepares them for successful careers in a variety of STEM professions. The application is open for high school seniors who are entering college as first-time freshmen in fall 2025.

Eligibility Criteria

To qualify, applicants must:

- - Be African American, Hispanic American, Asian Pacific Islander American, American Indian / Alaskan Native
- - Be a citizen, legal permanent resident, or national of the United States
- - Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on an unweighted 4.0 scale
- - Pursued a rigorous course of study in high school in math and science courses, including pre-calculus
- - Have demonstrated financial and unmet need as measured by the student's college or university
- - Show evidence of readiness for and commitment to pursue STEM majors, including biological/life sciences, physics, chemistry, computer science/engineering, information sciences, engineering (industrial, mechanical, electrical or chemical), mathematics
