Let's do a quick dive into [EBESCO's](#) collection of databases:

MyEBESCO - let's create an account. This is a really useful feature, which allows you to save articles and article searches according to “projects” you create. Let's start by adding our JWU email and a password to create an account. Then, we can create a project for this class and finally, save articles we find into the project file we created.

Let's start with a simple title search: enter the title and choose “Title” from the drop down box.

Now, let's explore the subjects available: Feminism in Literature could be interesting:
