

Primary Source—Reprinted in Another Source

Please note, regarding primary sources within a source: Some of our library database and eBook resources (such as *American Decades Primary Sources*) include the citation for one source and the citation for the other, but do not show the entire citation as it should be listed on your Works Cited page. See the following examples which show how to cite a primary source that appears in another source.

Basic structure for the citation:

Primary Source Author's Last Name, First Name. Full citation information for the primary source (book, article, etc.): includes title, publisher, and publication date of original source. Reprinted in Full citation information for the database or book in which the primary source was reprinted.

Examples of primary sources reprinted in another source, with proper MLA formatting:

McAndrew, John. "Our Architecture Is Our Portrait." *The New York Times Magazine*, January 18, 1953, 12-14. Reprinted in *American Decades Primary Sources*. Vol. 6: 1950-1959. Ed. Cynthia Rose. Detroit: Gale, 2004. 155-160. *Gale Virtual Reference Library*. Web. 27 Mar. 2014.
