For this, could you share your screen with me. Could you show me how you would search up a music event in LA? Whether it's like through your app or just a browser.

Okay, I'm gonna share my screen on my phone. Is it working? Yeah. Okay. All righty. So what am I searching, a music event in LA?

Los Angeles, music Ticketmaster. All right. My wifi is so slow today. So I have to find one that I would go to? Okay, if they're not canceled then. Let's see how we, select. Okay sure. Select genre. Let's do pop. Select date Oh my god. What's happening? Date range? Nah let's just do all dates. Okay, let's see. Oh my god 1D? May 23rd? Cancelled, can't go do that. Umm Harry Styles September 2.

So why did you decide on this particular search result? You can look through the page first. Yeah.

Wait, what's your question?

Rebecca Lin 7:55

Why did you decide on this particular search result?

Participant 3 8:00

Cuz I like Harry Styles.

Rebecca Lin 8:07

How well do you think the search functions on Ticketmaster worked? Like, are you able to find events that you're looking for? And or tickets for these events? And are there any challenges or issues that come up?

Participant 3 8:22

Um, I think it was pretty easy because like, I could filter by genre and the dates I wanted. Um, yeah, I'd say pretty easy, not really any challenges.

Rebecca Lin 8:42

And then so what factors are most important or do you look for when searching for like these event to attend, for example, like the ticket prices, distance, venue, genre, like how important are these to you?

Participant 3 8:57

Um, probably ticket prices is a big one. Cuz I don't want to spend that much money. And then probably the date availability like if I am free on that day if I don't got anything planned. And then yeah, if I like, like the music of the event, that's probably a big one.

Next. All right. So what other websites or apps do you use to find local music events and or tickets? And it'd be helpful to know if you use the website or app for either just finding local music events or just getting tickets or both.

Um, finding events? Yeah, mainly Ticketmaster. Sometimes Live Nation. Sometimes I just see events on Facebook and I'm like, Oh, so that's happening. Um, for tickets. Yeah, Ticketmaster, sometimes SeatGeek. What else, I can't really remember. Those are probably the big ones.

Okay, and then why do you prefer Ticketmaster over those alternatives?

Because it's usually reliable and you can search for the events that you're interested in and then yeah the buying tickets for seats is usually reliable because sometimes I get scared if I buy on a resale site. That someone's going to scam me and I'll be sad.

And lastly, whatever ways without using like a search engine would find out about local events. So maybe it's like how often do you hear about events through word of mouth?

Um, I feel like I hear most of them are about word of mouth. I don't usually just search Ticketmaster for events. So yeah, usually through word of mouth, probably on Facebook. Like if someone like clicks interested or going to like some sort of music event, I'll see it on my feed. Or like, people will talk about it in on their social media, or people, like if they're like, getting tickets to an event on their social media. Or what was I gonna say? I'm gonna say something. Yeah, that's how I Yeah, I feel like I hear about events through word of mouth pretty often.

How often ever, or have you gone to like the box office at a venue?

Uh, not really. I don't think for a music event that I've ever been to the box office.

Free or small events? Social media.

Nice, so now we'll be moving on to the task portion of this interview. If you could go to the next page on the questionnaire. Okay. We'll be taking a look at Hearby which is a local, live musical event discovery app. I'll be asking you to complete a series of tasks on the app and ask that you describe out loud what you're thinking and doing. Just try your best and it's okay if you're not able to complete them. So yeah, next page should be asking you if you've ever used Hearby.

Alright, so in this session, I'll ask you to do some tasks. Again, please think or talk about as you go through each task. So the next page should be the first task. And it should start screen sharing on your on zoom.

I might have spelled it wrong. It should be Hear as in listening. Yeah, that should be it. If you could share your location. Okay, so just as like a disclaimer, because of COVID, the search functions are kind of limited on this app. So I'll be saying like certain dates, just assume that today on this app, it is March 13. Friday, March 13.

Yeah. So your first task is to find a local concert. Supposed that is Saturday, March 14 at 6pm and you're out with your friends this evening looking for something to do. We all enjoy live music and decide to search if there are any concerts in walking distance that you can attend. And due to context limitations, assume that walking distance is like five miles or less. So step one would be to find the concerts for Saturday, March 14. Step two is to find concerts and walking distance. Step three is to find concerts that start after 6pm. And step four is to find out how long it takes to walk there.

Okay. Um, tomorrow? So the app thinks it's March 13th. Yes. Okay, tomorrow. Got it. Got it. Yeah. Okay. So tomorrow, walking distance. Following? Oh, I can see where I am. Where's this one? Can I click on it? No. Sort of. Oh, wait I clicked on the thing. That's not what I wanted. Sort distance, oh let's do time first. Time? 2am? Well that's, Time, Time Time.

Actually, if you could change your city to Los Angeles, okay, sorry I just noticed.

Oh city, Los Angeles. Okay, okay for tomorrow, distance. Saturday ah Hmm. Well, closest one is, looks to be 19 miles away, um, but it's after six. Is that really the closest one? That's Saturday.

Yeah, and for the for step four, you can check off that you did it. So, no worries.

Should I say that I found concerts in walking distance?

Yeah, that's all right next. All right. So task two is to discover a new venue. Suppose that you love jazz music and you want to find a new venue to check out. So step one would be to check out the venues nearby, in this case, just search around Los Angeles. Step two is to learn more about the venues. And then step three is to find a spot that primarily features jazz music.

I think we were having trouble with this earlier so it might not load.

Okay. Gosh, dang it. My wifi sucks. Will it let me look at it? Oh, this one works. Weird. Okay, primarily features jazz. Upcoming...so upcoming events? I don't know. Why won't that one work? All the other ones work. Weird. All right well I mean I'm guessing this jazz lounge primarily features jazz music.

Alright, if you try to maybe find a different venue.

Participant 3 28:34

Okay, all right. Um okay venue? Following? Band? All right, I'm trying to sort, it's not letting me click it. Okay. Oh here we go. Oh, oh, it's alphabetical. Okay, let's go back to venue, let's do that. Okay, let me just put jazz music. Oh my god, jazz music. No results? Oh my god. Jazz massagers? What? Jazz. Okay, we're gonna search jazz. Okay. Ojai deer Lodge. Farm to Table dining regular live music. How do I know this artist is a jazz artist? Oh, I can click their links. Umm, Spotify? What will Spotify tell me? Oo, jazz oaky. They feature jazz. Wait let me click on something else. There's no link. He has no link either.

Okay, TJ okay, maybe that's not primarily jazz. Navajo live. Live music and karaoke large dance floor. I don't know if these are jazz artists. They don't have links. Nope. Cajun inspired fair live entertainment. Oh, jazz, okay. Okay. Oo, music that feeds the soul. That sounds like jazz music. Oh yeah, Jazz at Jax.

Okay. There's that one, where is it? Newport Beach? Okay. All right now. Yeah, and then I'm sorry, my Wi Fi so slow. Should I check the thingys?

If you could go to the questionnaire and just check off the boxes again for all it felt like you were able to complete.

Okay, alrighty.

Alrighty. All right, and then we'll move on to the last task. So task 3 is to discover a new artist. Suppose it is Friday, March 13. And you're looking to attend a live music event. You like rock, hip hop, and rap, and want to check out new artists in one of those genres. Step one is to go to the list of events for Friday, March 13. Step two is to discover a rock, hip hop or rap artists, and step three is to preview one of their songs.

Okay trying to go back. I'm confused why it's showing me a bunch of venues. Back, mmm, it's being a bit slow. It might be my phone. Mmm, next. Okay, okay. Why isn't it exiting? Oh, what's this? Following.

I don't know why it's not letting me Okay. I'm gonna restart the app real quick because it's not working. Alrighty. Okay, so date today. Go to the list of the events. Okay, now we'll try rap. Hip Hop was not working. All right, okay. Um event, the surfer Sunday. Let's look at band, the bands. No upcoming events. That's not gonna help me. Let's try events. I'm trying to press show all. It's not letting me show all. Click, no okay. That wasn't working. Is it doing it again? No. Dang it. Okay. Okay here we go here we go.

All right, I'm just gonna click one of these. Um, Aces and Eights. Okay, they don't have a link. Umm, dance party jams DJ head to head. Nope, no links. Hooked and faded all times, that sounds...they don't have a link either. Kill Love. Nope, come on, rock rock. Jazz, mariachi, nameless? They don't have links either. Ronnie George band. No links okay, going back. Ryan how. And no links again. Star dog. No links. No links. The craze, can click on that? No, I can't. Umm, the wild side band. Why do none of these bands have links to their things. Oh, wow UCLA. Um, oh here we go. We got a link.. Let's see what they're about. Are they rock? They look rock. It's loading. Okay. Let's check their about. Do they have an about? No? Alright, now, back to the drawing board. Umm, soul asylum. Ooh, okay, Spotify. Well they got a lot of listeners, are they popular? Let's see, what kinda music, oh rock. Let's preview a song. Let's do their number one hit runaway train. Is it playing? Will it play if I'm on zoom?

I don't know. I feel like it might just be it not playing.

All right. We got there.

If you could do the same thing and go to the questionnaire and just check off the boxes for the tasks you felt like you were able to complete. And you can stop screen sharing.

Okay, so yeah, on the questionnaire we'll be moving on to the post test questions. This is designed to tell us how you feel about that app that you used today. So just choose the number that most clearly expresses how you feel about each particular statement. The first one is how easy or difficult was it to perform each task?

I'm gonna say neutral. I found the app very cumbersome to use. I'm gonna say somewhat agree. I felt very confident using the app. I'm gonna say somewhat disagree. I needed to learn a lot of things before I could get going with this app. Ah, I'm gonna say neutral.

Next page it's just the product satisfaction card. So just select the five words that most closely matched your personal reactions to the app you just used.

Okay, five words. I'm gonna say, the app was. Excuse me Um, My personal reactions? I felt kind of busy. Um, I think it was familiar to some extent. Um.
