In the final part, students learn to understand the bureaucratic environment which includes the reciprocity between the development of bureaucracy and politics, bureaucracy and democracy, bureaucracy and the development of the market economy and globalization, bureaucracy and regional autonomy, bureaucratic reform, the development of new paradigms (new governance and new public management).
