






none			The absence of government. There is no government to make or enforce laws.		Somalia
one			Rule by kings, queens and other types of royalty power, which is passed down, usually from father to son		France in the 1600s and 1700s
			power is taken by force by dictators who have total control over the lives of the people; people have few rights		Nazi Germany
few			rule by a small group of wealthy and well educated citizens, power is usually passed down within certain families		Medieval Europe
			rule by a group of religious leaders; religious law is used to govern		the Islamic Republic of Iran
all			citizens vote directly on issues		Ancient Athens
			People elect representatives who vote on the issues. Usually has a constitution.		USA
