Lesson Topic : Making inferences Year Group : Year 7 and 8

Prior knowledge	The students have learnt about inferencing with their previous teachers and we had touched on it earlier in the year. However, I usually like to revisit this and commit a chunk of time on inferencing as it is often a skill that my students find difficult.	
Lesson Sequence	We started by watching a video about inferencing and unpacked what it means to make an inference. As a class we then practiced using this skill by interpreting a few images - first identifying the clues and then piecing them together to tell the whole story. I then read with small groups to practice applying this skill to texts. The students independently made inferences based on a range of texts and images, before creating their own image with a deeper meaning.	



Session Outline

- 1. Watch the short video to identify what an inference is and unpack the word
- 2. Practice making an inference as a class using an image
- 3. In small groups make inferences from a text using our prior knowledge and the clues from the story.
- 4. Practice making inferences independently using a range of images and texts
- 5. Create an image with a deeper meaning and share it on your blog

Student Activity	Teacher Activity
Learn: Watch the video and discuss what an inference is	Unpack the word inference and discuss how to infer information from an image or text.
Infer the deeper meaning behind the images with the class and about the text	Facilitate a class discussion around an image and infer the meaning behind it.
as a small group	Work with reading groups to infer meaning behind a short text and a journa story.
Create: An image that conveys a deeper meaning	Explain the create task using some student-made examples. Set up a rotation with the class ipads/ camera for those using photography.
Share: Share your creation on your blog. Can your audience infer the meaning behind it?	Support students with any issues transferring images from the camera/ipad to their chromebooks.

Lesson Content - This lesson sequence was scaffolded really well - using the images really helped the students to get the hang of using the clues in the text and their prior knowledge to unpack meaning. Over the week I gave more control to the students until they are independently inferencing and then coming up with an idea for an image that requires the audience to make an inference.
