

Global Big Day: How to Participate?

The biggest birding day of the year—<u>Global Big Day</u>—is almost here. Join us Saturday, May 10, 2025, to count as many birds as possible in a 24 hour period.

Participating is easy—you can even join in on the fun of Global Big Day from home! If you can spare as little as 10 minutes, report your bird observations to **eBird online** or with the **free eBird Mobile app**. If you have more time, visit multiple sites throughout the day and submit a checklist for each site.


We've brought back our popular teams competition this year to reignite the energy, excitement, and camaraderie that's associated with Global Big Day. Join a team, win prizes, and help us raise funds to **keep our critical programs running and serving the birds and communities of the Caribbean**, in the face of devastating federal funding cuts to our bird conservation programs.

The Steps

- 1. Sign up: choose a team, or create a team, on the BirdsCaribbean Global Big Day Event Page. Check out this 'how to guide' for step-by-step instructions to create a team. If you would like to join a team, simply click the "Join a team" button next to the Team Leaderboard, and select the "Join an existing team" option. Although some teams have an island or country name with most members from that island, note that anyone from anywhere in the world can join any of our teams. And if your island doesn't currently have a team—now is the perfect time to make one!!
- Get an eBird account: eBird is a worldwide bird checklist program used by
 millions of birders. It's what allows us to compile everyone's sightings into a
 single massive Global Big Day (GBD) list—while at the same time collecting the
 data to help scientists better understand birds. It's 100% free from start to finish.



3. Download eBird Mobile: the app is available for free on both the Google Play and App Stores. Click the links to go to the download page for each. On eBird mobile, click "...more" on the bottom right, then click "Settings and Account." Select a "Pack" (top of page) which is a list of all the birds in your country or state - very helpful!



- 4. Watch birds on 10 May: It's that simple. You don't need to be a bird expert or go out all day long, even 10 minutes of birding from home counts. Global Big Day runs from midnight to midnight in your local time zone. You can report what you find from anywhere in the world. If you're on one of our GBD teams and wish to add as many birds as possible to your team's overall total list and stats (we are having a friendly competition, after all!), then go out and bird at as many sites as you can on May 10th!
- 5. Enter what you see and hear in eBird: You can enter your sightings via the eBird website or the free eBird Mobile app to make submitting lists even easier. Importantly you need to be sure that your eBird lists are shared with your team! You can do this in two ways. The first (and easiest!), is via a team Trip Report, you need to have joined a Trip Report to do this—look for the invitation to join from your team leader on eBird. If you have not received an invite yet, ask your team leader to invite you with your eBird username (or the email you use with your eBird account) (Check this sheet to see your team's

name, team eBird username, team leader to contact). Once you've joined a trip report ALL your lists from Big Day will automatically be added to your team!

If you haven't joined the Trip Report for your team you can still share your checklist with regular checklist sharing. Get more details on how to share your eBird checklists with your team here! 6. **Be sure to start a new checklist for each new site!** When you move between sites, start a new checklist for <u>stationary</u> counts. For <u>traveling</u> counts, the guidelines are to keep them to less than 5 miles/ 8 kms and 3 hours, then start a new checklist. If driving from site to site, please create a separate list for each site. Shorter distances and durations are better for the scientific value of these observations.

If you do counts at any kind of wetland in the Caribbean (including beaches), please submit these as **Caribbean Waterbird Census (CWC)** counts. The way to do this on eBird has changed recently, and CWC is now a project. You need to join the project to add your CWC list, you can do this via our <u>project page</u>. Then, remember to choose 'Caribbean Waterbird Census' when starting a list in the eBird app (option above the 'start list button'); or choose from 'Caribbean Waterbird Census' from your projects submitting a list via the eBird website. **Read more about joining and using the CWC project on eBird here**.

- 7. **Take photos on GBD!** Of the birds you're seeing, beautiful habitats you're in, and the people you're with, or take a selfie!!! We will have prizes/ bragging rights for photos in different categories, for example, best bird photo, people photo, biggest rarity, funniest photo, etc. Here are winning photos from 2024 enjoy!
- 8. **Tag us on Social Media!** If you're active on social media, please use the hashtag #GlobalBigDayBirdsCarib and tag us @BirdsCaribbean. That way, we can see your stories and find and see each other's photos!
- 9. And of course, have fun watching the sightings roll in! During the day, use the trip report links on this spreadsheet to follow along with sightings from teammates in real-time on your team's Global Big Day eBird report page. Just click your team's report link and watch the checklists come in! (Or sneak a peek at how other teams are doing!)

Remember—It's a friendly (but fierce) competition, so consider setting goals for yourself and your team for the number of species you will see, number of team checklists, number of observers, number of endemics, amount of funds raised, etc.

<u>Check your team's stats from last year</u> and try to beat your numbers! Or, if you're a new team, use these to set some GBD goals! Cornell will provide a summary of stats from all the different regions of the world. Let's show up for the West Indies and have as many islands, species, and checklists as possible!!!
