

Paper Title Guidelines for Preparing 2-Page Extended Abstracts

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1 Introduction

This document describes the format for the 2-page extended abstract to be presented at the International Conference on Modern Manufacturing and Management Intelligence (ICMMMI 2024) to be held at NIT Jamshedpur, Jharkhand, India, from 5th -7th Dec, 2024. It is our goal to maintain a uniform degree of consistency between papers in the final proceedings/papers. This document has been created in the required format. It can therefore be used as a template by simply typing over the existing contents of the file.

The extended abstracts are strictly limited to two pages, which will be published in the Extended Abstract Volume for distribution among the congress participants if accepted.

2 Materials and Methodology

Please note that the first paragraph of a section or subsection is not indented. The first paragraphs that follow a table, figure, equation etc. do not have an indent, either. Subsequent paragraphs, however, are indented.

2.1 Sample Heading (2nd Level). Only two levels of headings should be numbered. Lower-level headings remain unnumbered; they are formatted as run-in headings.

2.1.1 Sample Heading (3rd Level). The contribution should contain no more than four levels of headings. The following Table 1 gives a summary of all heading levels.

Table 1. Table captions should be placed above the tables.

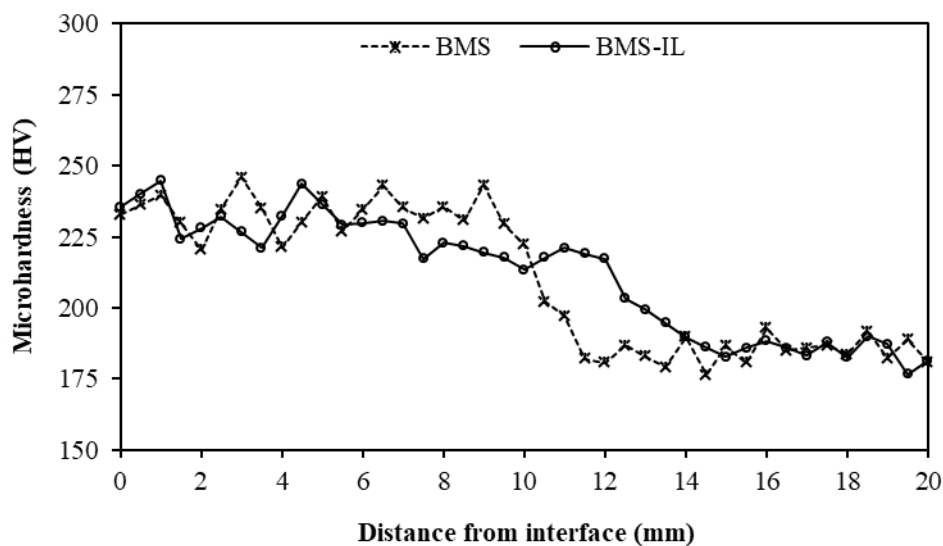
Heading level	Example	Font size and style
Title (centered)	Manuscript Title	14, Bold
1 st level Heading	Abstract, Introduction, etc.	12, Bold
2 nd level Heading	2.1 Experimental Procedures	10, Bold
3 rd Level heading	2.1.1 Materials	10, Italic

Displayed equations (use MathType or similar) are centered and set on a separate line.
