Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an evidence-based, tiered framework for supporting <i>students'</i> behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health. When implemented with fidelity, PBIS improves social emotional competence, academic success, and school climate. It also improves teacher health and wellbeing. Check in-Check out	Check-In, Check-Out (CI/CO) is a Tier 2 behavioral intervention for students needing additional support in meeting schoolwide (Tier 1) behavioral norms and expectations. CI/CO is an evidence-based intervention shown to increase academic engagement and decrease problem behavior. <p>Social Emotional Learning</p>	<p>Second Step (Pre-K): a classroom-based social skills program. It is designed to reduce impulsive, high-risk, and aggressive behaviors and increase children's social competence and other protective factors</p> <p>Rethink (Lessons for K-8, Self-Assessments for grades 3-8): Classroom based social skills program that promotes well-being and connectedness and success for students.
