Suffix	Etymology	Notes
-li/-ri	pre-Vaniuan, exact etymology unknown. Likely to have derived from Tahvic.	
-khan - kan	pre-Vaniuan, exact etymology unknown. Likely to have derived from Tahvic.	
-khaz - kaz	from the root word <i>khazat</i> meaning “great”.	
-baş	from the word <i>baş</i> meaning “head”.	
-us/-as	from the root word <i>usağ</i> meaning “flower”, also thought to have derived	

	from the proto-Amaian word *ys with the same meaning.	
prefix -uk	from the word <i>hok</i> meaning “high”.	
-tə -sə	from the root word <i>təsə</i> meaning “red”.	
-miş	from the root word <i>mişa</i> meaning “strong, powerful”.	
-şə	as/like/akin to.	
-du -də	Unknown etymology, thought to have derived from a pre-Vaniuan language, probably Gashar.	
-ta(n) -da(n)	Ohanian honorific	
-shi	Intensifier for qualities	
-məy	“lady” honorific title	
-y(ə)n	archaic form for “man”	
-su(m)	from Ohanian, “with the quality of, looking like”
