Text version of adapting and remixing a collection of images.

Introduction

The following questions will ask you which CC-licensed images can be combined and adapted to create a new image of a goldfish in a colourful bowl and which licence(s) can be used for the new images.

Refer to the licensing consideration tables to answer the questions.

Question 1: Mixing CC0 and CC BY

Image 1:

Fishbowl icon by J Alves from [Openclipart](#), released under [CC0](#).

Image 2:

Goldfish icon by Nook Fulloption (2017), from [The Noun Project](#), used under [CC BY 3.0](#).

Question: - True or False?

Image 1, licensed CC0, and Image 2, licensed CC BY 3.0, can be combined (remixed) to create a new icon.

Answer:

True. Works under CC0 and CC BY can be combined.

Question 2: Licensing a remix

Remixed Image:

“*Goldfish bowl icon*” is derived from “*Fishbowl*” by J Alves, Openclipart, [CC0](#) and “*goldfish*” by Nook Fulloption, The Noun Project, [CC BY 3.0](#)

Question: - Multiple choice

Which licence(s) can I use for my new remixed icon? (Select all that apply)

1. CC BY;
2. CC BY-NC;
3. CC BY-ND;
4. CC BY-NC-SA;
5. CC0;
6. CC BY-NC-ND;
7. CC BY-SA.

Answer:

Numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7. can be used.

Number 5, CC0, is not an option because one of the originals is licensed CC BY. CC BY works cannot be dedicated to the public domain.

Question 3: Mixing CC BY and CC BY SA

Image 1:

Goldfish bowl icon by JB, [CC BY 4.0](#).

Image 2:

The Fish Tank by Russell Yarwood (2006), from [Flickr](#), used under [CC BY-SA 2.0](#).

Question: - True or False?

The goldfish bowl icon, licensed CC BY 4.0, and fish tank image, licensed CC BY-SA 2.0 can be combined to create a new image.

Answer:

True. CC BY and CC BY-SA licences are compatible.

Question 4: Licensing a remix that includes CC BY-SA

Image:

Colourful Goldfish Bowl is derived from “*Fishbowl*” by J Alves, CC0; “*goldfish*” by Nook Fulloption, CC BY 3.0, and “*The Fish Tank*” by Russell Yarwood, CC BY-SA 2.0.

Question: - Multiple choice

Which licence(s) can I use for my new remixed image of a colourful goldfish bowl?
(Select all that apply)

1. CC BY;
2. CC BY-NC;
3. CC BY-ND;
4. CC BY-NC-SA;
5. CC0;
6. CC BY-NC-ND;
7. CC BY-SA.

Answer:

Number 7, CC BY-SA, is the only option. Adaptations of works licenced under CC BY SA must also be shared under the same licence.

Question 5: Mixing a CC BY and a CC BY NC work for an OER

Image 1:

Goldfish bowl icon by JB, [CC BY 4.0](#).

Image 2:

Pete's Fish Tank by Peter Kelly (2006), [Flickr](#), [CC BY-NC 2.0](#)

Question: - True or False?

The CC BY icon and CC BY-NC fish tank image can be combined to create a new image for use in a free OER.

Answer:

True. CC BY and CC BY-NC are compatible licences if the use is for non-commercial purposes.

Question 6: Mixing a CC BY work and a CC BY NC work for advertising a pet shop.

Image 1:

Goldfish bowl icon by JB, [CC BY 4.0](#).

Image 2:

Pete's Fish Tank by Peter Kelly (2006), [Flickr](#), [CC BY-NC 2.0](#)

Question: - True or False?

The CC BY icon and CC BY-NC fish tank image can be combined to create a new image for advertising a shop.

Answer:

False. CC BY-NC works cannot be used for commercial purposes.

Question 7: Licensing a remix that includes CC BY-NC

Image:

Colourful Goldfish in Another Bowl is derived from “*Fishbowl*” by J_Alves, CC0; “*goldfish*” by Nook Fulloption, CC BY 3.0 and “*Pete's Fish Tank*” by Peter Kelly, CC BY-NC 2.0.

Question: - Multiple choice

Which licence(s) can I use for my new remixed image of a colourful goldfish in another bowl? (Select all that apply)

1. CC BY;
2. CC BY-NC;
3. CC BY-ND;
4. CC BY-NC-SA;
5. CC0;

- 6. CC BY-NC-ND;
- 7. CC BY-SA.

Answer:

Number 2, CC BY-NC, or Number 4, CC BY-NC-SA, or Number 6, CC BY-NC-ND are correct. Adaptations of BY-NC works must use the same or a more restrictive NC licence.

Question 8: Mixing a CC BY work and a CC BY ND work

Image 1:

Goldfish bowl icon by JB, [CC BY 4.0](#).

Image 2:

Bubbles in the Fish Tank by spyzter (2005), [Flickr](#), [CC BY-ND 2.0](#)

Question: - True or False?

I can use the “Bubbles in a fish tank” image for my goldfish bowl background.

Answer:

False. Works with ND licences cannot be adapted or remixed.
