Reconstruction was a failure because Lincoln was the assassinated. After that, the 17th president, Andrew Johnson believed that people have the right to have slaves. Another reason why Reconstruction was a failure was the failure of the Freedmen's Bureau. Freedmen's Bureau was undersupported in many ways. Another reason was that the Supreme court overturned the Civil Rights Act. The last reason why was because there was a big loophole in the 13th amendment which freed the slaves.

He also did not like that they would have the right to vote. Congress thought they should do it but Johnson didn't want those things to happen. I think congress was right to disagree with the president about that because who cares about their skin color.

The Reconstruction failure does impact our world today. If the Reconstruction was a success people of color would not have as much freedom they have today.
