Penn High School provides this consent from you before students receive human sexuality instruction as part of the Growth and Development unit in your child's Health class. The school corporation's curriculum educates students about reproductive science, reproductive health and wellness, human development, childhood development, as well as abstinence from sexual activities outside of marriage and sexually transmitted infections, as required by Indiana law. The exact instructional content varies upon the course, the age and grade level of the students. The instruction provided is also designed to satisfy the Indiana Academic Standards for Child Development and Human Development. Instruction for this unit will be taught to male and female students in a unified setting. The instruction on human sexuality for this course will be taught by a **male / female** teacher.

If a student does not participate in the instruction on human sexuality, Penn High School will provide alternative, academic instruction to the student during the same time frame that the instruction on human sexuality is offered.

In your child's Health class this year, students will be studying a growth and development unit that covers the endocrine system, the male reproductive system, and the female reproductive system. Lessons will focus on the structures and functions of each system, how to care for them, and common health concerns that may arise. Students will also receive instruction on related topics such as hormones, reproduction, abstinence, sexually transmitted diseases, contraception methods and their effectiveness, and the importance of regular check-ups and healthy decision-making. This unit is designed to provide students with accurate, age-appropriate knowledge to support their overall health and well-being.

### **Penn High School SEA 442 Narrative**

Penn High School will comply with the requirements of Senate Enrolled Act (SEA) 442 regarding instruction on human sexuality or sexually transmitted infections by:

1. Requiring a teacher to teach abstinence from sexual activity outside of marriage as the expected standard for all school age children.
2. Incorporating instruction that shares abstinence from sexual activity is the only certain way to avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections, and other associated health problems.
3. Incorporating instruction that states the best way to avoid sexually transmitted infections and other associated health problems is to establish a mutually faithful monogamous relationship in the context of marriage;
4. Including age appropriate instruction concerning the importance of consent to sexual activity between two individuals; and
5. Except as provided in subsection (b), providing an in-person presentation on human growth and development during pregnancy that is medically accurate and age appropriate and includes the following:
  - (A) A high definition ultrasound video, at least three minutes in duration, showing the development of the brain, heart, sex organs, and other vital organs in early fetal development.
  - (B) A high quality computer generated rendering or animation showing the process of fertilization and each stage of fetal development inside the uterus, noting significant markers in cell growth and organ development for every week of pregnancy from fertilization to birth.

Penn High School students who are enrolled in a Health class will be studying a growth and development unit that covers the endocrine system, the male reproductive system, and the female reproductive system. Lessons will focus on the structures and functions of each system, how to care for them, and common health concerns that may arise. Students will also receive instruction on related topics such as hormones, reproduction, abstinence, sexually transmitted diseases, contraception methods and their effectiveness, and the importance of regular check-ups and healthy decision-making. This unit is designed to provide students with accurate, age-appropriate knowledge to support their overall health and well-being.
