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GUIDE FOR AUTHORS JURNAL AKUAKULTUR INDONESIA

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ARTICLE PREPARATION

I. General provisions

1. The manuscript is written with single-column format using 12 pts Times New Roman. Maximum word for each article is 12,000 words
2. Figures and tables should stand alone, provide informative captions
3. Use the international system of units (SI) or SI-derived units to express unit of measurements. including that that derived units must be used. Use the slash to indicate a ratio (e.g., mg/L instead of mg.L⁻¹).
4. All biota names should be followed by their scientific names when first used in the text. If no common name exists in English, only scientific name should be used
5. Define abbreviations that are not standard in aquaculture field at their first mention
6. Numbers under 10 should be spelt out, except for measurement with a unit . Do not start the sentences with numbers. Use commas to separate thousands and a dot for decimals.
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- For three or more authors: Smith *et al.* (1994) or (Smith *et al.*, 1994)
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- Groups of references is listed chronologically using brackets and separated by semicolon. Examples: (Smith, 1991; Jones, 1994)

9. Each section header should be written in bold capital letters (uppercase) with center alignment. Sub-section should be written in bold sentence case letters with left alignment

II. Articles Structure

The article is arranged in the following order:

1. TITLE

A concise and informative title should be written in English and followed with its translation in Bahasa. The titles should be written using bold sentence case letters with center alignment

2. THE AUTHOR'S NAME AND THEIR INSTITUTION

Write the names of the authors and their institutions accurately after the title of article. For example:

First Author¹, Second Author²

¹First Author's Institution,

²Second Author's Institution.

Correspondence: Address of corresponding author followed by an e-mail address: email@email.com

3. ABSTRACT

Abstract should be written in English and Bahasa (maximum 250 words). It contains a brief of summary of the article including the objective of the research, the main methodology, results and conclusion. Please avoid of using non-standard or uncommon abbreviations.

4. KEYWORDS

A maximum of 5 keywords should be written in alphabetical order and provided both in English and in Bahasa.

5. INTRODUCTION

This section contains the background and the aim of the research

6. MATERIALS AND METHODS

This section presents a clear and concise research procedures that allows the work to be reproduced by another researcher. Methods that have been published previously should be summarize and indicated by a reference, any modifications should also be described.

7. RESULTS

Results should be written separately from the discussion. The results should be presented clearly and in detail. The statements on the results can be based on a method that has been done or presented in the form of texts, tables, and figures.

8. DISCUSSION

The results of the data should be discussed in this section. This section should explore the significance of the results and/or comparison to previous research, including the uniqueness of the research.

9. CONCLUSION

This section should present the conclusions of the study, and could be written separately or included as a part of the discussion.

10. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

This section is used to acknowledge any institutions or individuals that provide funding sources or help during the research.

11. REFERENCES

References should contain a list of references cited in the manuscript that is arranged in alphabetically by the last name of the first author. If there are two or more publications from the same author(s) in the same year, add letters to the year of publication to distinguish each reference (example: (Alimuddin *et al.*, 2009a, b; Ekasari & Wiyoto 2010a).

Chapters in an edited book

Author KL, Author MN. 2012. The title of the chapter: Subtitle. In: the Editor, the Editor of EF, Editor GH (eds). Title of Book, 2nd edition. Place of publication: Name of Publisher. pp page reference. Example: JH Tidwell, Allan g. 2012. The Role of Aquaculture: the Status of Aquaculture. In: Tidwell JH (ed). Aquaculture Production Systems. Iowa, USA: John Wiley & Sons. pp. 7–11.

Thesis or dissertation

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12. TABLES

The titles of the tables should be consecutively numbered. Please provide an editable form of tables and not as images. If applicable, please present the data in means with standard deviations or standard errors. All abbreviations and symbols should be described in footnotes. Use a font size of **10 pts** for the title and the content of the tables. The table should be cited in the text.

In English, not more than 250 words. It consist of introduction, methods, results, and conclusion that clearly and briefly written (TNR 12, justified, single space).

Keyword: must be written in not more than 5 words and alphabetically listed

ABSTRAK

In Bahasa Indonesia, not more than 250 words. It consist of introduction, methods, results, and conclusion that clearly and briefly written (TNR 12, justified, single space).

Kata kunci: must be written in not more than 5 words and alphabetically listed

INTRODUCTION

Author should state introduction and the scientific argument of the study. It should be effectively and efficiently written completed by supportive reference. (TNR 12, justified, single space).

MATERIALS AND METHODS

This section presents a clear and concise research procedures that allows the work to be reproduced by another researcher. Methods that have been published previously should be summarize and indicated by a reference, any modifications should also be described. Materials of the study must be stated clearly, using the international system of units (SI) or SI-derived units to express unit of measurements, including that derived units must be used. Use the slash to indicate a ratio (e.g., mg/L instead of mg.L⁻¹). If the study consist of several consecutive step or methods, it must be divided to different sub chapter. Experimental design and data analysis is mandatory.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Result

Results should be written separately from the discussion. It only contains the tables and figures followed by the interpretation. An introductory statement before the tables or figures is required as

The results of the data should be discussed in this section. This section should explore the significance of the results and/or comparison to previous research, including the uniqueness of the research.

CONCLUSION

This section should present the conclusions of the study, and could be written separately or included as a part of the discussion.
