Dear Enloe High School Families,

Everyone deserves to feel safe and supported while they are on our campus. The safety and well-being of our students and staff is our top priority, and we are always going to be proactive to protect our school community. As part of our commitment to student safety and well-being, all Wake County Public School System middle and high schools are required to show videos explaining the **Say Something Anonymous Reporting System AND Protecting Our Students**.

Say Something Anonymous Reporting System

It is an additional option to our existing WCPSS tip line at (919) 856-1911 for anonymously reporting threats and concerns. WCPSS is rolling Say Something out across our district. The Say Something Anonymous Reporting System is a research-based violence prevention program offered by Sandy Hook Promise, a national nonprofit organization. It teaches the warning signs of potential violence or self-harm and provides students and staff with secure ways to share safety concerns through a mobile app, website, or phone call. More than 5,000 schools nationwide are using this program. This program will further enhance the student protections we have in place. We have included information about what the program is, how students can use it, and why we are adopting it in our schools below. This is our 2nd year using Say Something.

Protecting Our Students

A state law passed in 2023 requires that all public school students in grades 6-12 view these videos. These age-appropriate videos were developed by the Center for Safer Schools, in collaboration with Capitol Broadcasting Company. They are designed to educate students about inappropriate behavior and adult misconduct in school settings, to ensure students know skills to stay safe, and to help them identify trusted adults they can turn to for help. Our goal is to empower students with knowledge while approaching this sensitive topic with care and respect.

After watching the video, students will be able to:

- Understand what inappropriate behavior by an adult is and what it might look like if it is happening to them or someone they know
- Know how to practice healthy behaviors and skills to stay safe
- Identify a responsible adult who they can ask for help
