Center for Student Engagement Supporting Principles of Free Speech and Expression

Background: One of the concerns raised by students through the Speech and Expression Committee is the location of protest zones for events in campus spaces. The Center for Student Engagement is committed to supporting the principles of free speech on campus by promoting a culture of student organization programming that strongly encourages all on campus programs to accommodate the free exchange of expression in the following ways:

- 1. All speaking events or lectures hosted by student organizations should include a designated period of Question and Answer so that audience members may ask pointed questions to invited guest speakers.
- 2. All student organization sponsored events taking place in campus spaces should include a designated location for any potential protests or the expression of opposing ideas. These locations should be in close proximity to the event space in order to demonstrate to all event goers that there are a range of views on the particular topic at hand. The following schedule is recommended for protest zones:
