Guidelines

Here are some quick guidelines to get you started:

- Be polite, friendly, and understanding! Both mentors and students are learning how to play/teach.
- Try to talk around once a week. Set up a short meeting to discuss tactics for following games, talk about previous games and what could have been done better, or answer/ask questions.
- Be open and proactive! The program is designed so that you get out what you
 put in. The better your relationship with your mentor/students, the more you'll
 enjoy it.
- Mentors are allowed to give in game advice, but avoid telling students what to
 do. If possible, give general advice (e.g., what pieces are in good positions,
 bad positions, dangerous positions, etc) and comment on what they have
 already done and whether it was a good or bad decision.
- Finally, have fun. If you're not having fun, let Walkerthon know and he'll hook you up with someone else.
