

GRANT COMMENTS ON POTENTIAL CABINET RUMORS

NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE— Today, former Fremont Governor and Presidential hopeful Michael D. Grant held a rally in Nashville, Dixie, where he outlined his vision for a Grant presidency and responded to questions from 3 lucky audience members. Arriving in a more casual “dad fit” than his usual suit, Grant continues his recent efforts to tone down his image of wealth in favor of a more humble and relatable image, which is certain to play well with lower-income areas of the country. The Presidential Candidate also forgoed his famous white Rolls Royce, taking a ride in a local man’s truck to the event.

Grant opened the event with a speech, saying: “In one year, as Governor of Fremont, I lowered taxes on our key businesses, I repealed oppressive Democrat legislation which violated our Second Amendment rights, I can honestly say that, despite some of our compromises, we were able to make bigger strides in Fremont towards restoring the rights of the people than any previous administration. That is why I am running for President. If you choose Grant as your next President, you can expect a presidency that is fighting for freedom on every front, which protects *your* rights. Not only that, but unlike what you have been given for the past 12

months, you can expect a presidency that is visible. I will be on your televisions week in, week out, rain or shine, to make sure you are kept up to date on what we're doing in Washington. Because what is the **point** of a government whose citizens don't know what they're doing? If the people who put you in power don't know what you're doing with that power, I think yhat's bordering on autocracy and its certainly not the American way!"

After delivering some inspiring words, Grant opened the floor to questions from those closest to his podium. One man raised his hand to ask about an article he read in the National Review, which suggested that Secretary of Defense Namreenactor could be first to go if Grant wins the presidency. Grant responded: "I love the National Review, its a strong source of information for conservative readers, but that rumor just isn't true. I have spoken privately with Namreenactor and I have said to him that, if I am elected, I'll be inviting him to continue serving as Secretary of Defense. The MO of the Defense Department may change slightly under my administration but I'll be doing what I can to make sure Nam keeps his job."

A woman raised her hand to ask about the Department of Education, saying she is against the way in which education is excluding parents. Grant told her: "I agree with you 100%, I have children myself and I do worry about the sort of stuff they're going to be faced with when they go to school. But its important for us to take a strong stance against that. I believe that, ultimately, a child's upbringing is the responsibility of parents and that parental voice should be far louder in our education system that it is now. With regard to the DOE, if elected there will be very big reforms to the way it works and we do intend to return most of its functions to the state governments, allowing us to localize and target our education towards our children's specific needs. I also plan to take a hard stance against propaganda in our schools, this is something I'll admit that I made a mistake by compromising with in Fremont, that was a mistake that I won't be making again. As my own children get older, I can see that what our kids need is a comprehensive, politically neutral education which doesn't interfere with conversations that would be better had at home." Grant was rewarded with applause for this statement, although the ramifications of admitting a fault in his Fremont administration could have interesting effects. It may help Grant to gather more supporters, who respect the change he has chosen to make in his political approach, but it may also drive away some hardline supporters.

Grant is expected to make an appearance next week in Houston, Texas where he has invited Whitey to join him at a rally. Grant also asked his former friend Governor Seldom to meet with him but has reportedly been denied by the Governor, a hardcore RMSteve supporter.
