Guidance Information – May/June 2022

Course Request Letters – Course request letters for the 2022-2023 school year were available in StudentVue and ParentVue starting in March 2022. This was Indian River's official notification of the classes that our students signed up for next year. Changes were due by the end of March. At this point course request changes will not be made unless there is an academic reason. If you still need to make a course request change, you will need to contact the assigned school counselors via e-mail or make an appointment over the summer to see if it is still possible.

SOL Testing – the majority of SOL End of Course testing will take place on May 26 (English 11 Reading), May 27 (History), June 2 (Science) and June 3 (Math). Students in SOL courses should check with their SOL teachers to confirm if they are or are not taking the SOL test. SOL teachers can provide all of the detailed information required for the testing days. Make up testing will also take place between May 31 and June 9.

Summer School Registration – students are now able to register for summer school with their school counselors through noon on June 10, 2022. Classes are free, but there are a limited number of classes that are offered in summer school. Summer school classes will be asynchronous (no live instruction) online classes. In order to register, students or parents/guardians must contact the assigned school counselor by June 10 at noon. There will be no registration from June 10 (after 12:00) through June 20. Beginning June 21, students can register with the IRHS School Counselor during designated hours located on the summer school flyer. June 21 - 9am - noon and June 22 - 9am to noon.

Who may want to consider going to summer school?

- 1. Students who have failed a course during the year and would like to make it up during the summer.
- 2. Students who are fall or winter athletes and need to take a class to meet VHSL requirements (must pass three out of four credit bearing classes this semester to be eligible for Fall and Winter sports)
- 3. Any rising senior who will need an extra class in order to graduate on time in June 2023.

<u>Class of 2022 Graduation Information</u> –College bound seniors are reminded to request a final transcript through Parchment to be sent to their college of choice. Colleges require that they receive these final transcripts to complete the registration process. Transcripts will be released to the colleges sometime between June 28 -June 30. Seniors should be aware that final transcripts won't be ready until June 28, so plan your summer college registration days accordingly. Seniors are also reminded that their Parchment account will be attached to them forever, and that they should remember their e-mail address and password so that they may order transcripts in the future. After August 1, seniors will be considered alumni and there will be a fee for requesting transcripts through Parchment. Seniors are reminded that their Chesapeake School e-mail addresses will be inactivated after graduation.

<u>Final report cards</u> will be made available through ParentVue and StudentVue on June 21 in the afternoon Final report cards are <u>not</u> stamped with promotion status on them. Please see the promotion requirements listed above.
