Lodge Grant Applications Close This Friday

All lodges looking to make improvements to their lodge homes through the 2023-24 Lodge Grant Program must complete their applications by close of business this Friday, August 11th. The application can be accessed by administrators on LCL web.

Lodge Grants are intended to provide funds for infrastructure/decor improvements to make the home more inviting for new and existing members. Grants in this program can reach up to \$25,000 per approved lodge. Last year, 177 lodges received grants in excess of \$1,250,000 combined. Requirements for lodges to apply for either 2023-24 grant program:

- As in the past, lodges <u>must</u> have at least one representative scanned into the **International** Moose Convention to qualify.
- New starting in 2023, lodges <u>must</u> have had at least one representative at their **Association's** Midyear Conference.

Chastain Heads for Indy This Week

Moose NASCAR driver Ross Chastain will have a busy weekend at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway this weekend, hopefully culminating in a Cup Series win on Sunday. Chastain brings some momentum to Indianapolis after leading the first 16 laps and finishing seventh in Monday's rain-delayed race at Michigan International Speedway.

Chastain will drive the blue and black No. 1 Chevrolet Camaro for Trackhouse Racing in Sunday's Cup Series race where he should be one of the favorites. In last year's Indy race, Ross appeared to finish second but he was later penalized by NASCAR and relegated to a 27th-place for using the access road to avoid trouble on the course just before the end of the race.

He should become even more familiar with the layout after driving the No. 91 Chevrolet in Saturday's Xfinity race for DGM Racing. Before his work at the big track begins, he'll be at Indianapolis Raceway Park Friday night to watch his younger brother Chad Chastain, as well as Cup teammate Shane van Gisbergen, drive in the Truck Series race for Niece Motorsports.

Moose members can watch the Cup Series race this Sunday at 2:30pm ET on NBC.
