



Their modern hard-cover anthology revisits an archive of 86 vintage and recent TALA cookbooks from across the U.S., with recipes re-created and photographed in 75 test kitchens across the country.

The Making of SerVe:

With the organization's Centennial approaching, TALA Unit 1879 at CSU embarked on this ambitious mission in the spring of 2017. Click <u>here</u> for a pictorial overview of our process.

Collecting—We began collecting TALA cookbooks from every era and state, documenting our growing archives on an interactive map on our website. Books were donated and lent from home kitchens across the country; others were purchased from online collectors. A Facebook page encouraged participation.

Selecting and Testing—We chose the most compelling and timeless recipes, those that revealed interesting details about time and place, such as sugarless World War Cake, Soup Can Bread, Stuffed Pork Chops...even Gelatin Salad. Home cooks from Seattle to the Bronx volunteered to re-create recipes, taking on the challenge of translating recipes that called for "15 cents worth of pork" and instructions to "bake in a warm oven."

Modernizing—Using notes from those test kitchens, we rewrote the recipes in a professional, contemporary format with modern ingredients and methods. We sent revised recipes to testers again to ensure their accuracy and invited photos—the strongest of which were used in the book.

Gathering—We held events featuring *SerVe* recipes, including a luncheon honoring student-veterans on campus, a peach cobbler fundraiser for Honor Flight, a veterans' storytelling event at a coffee shop, a S**t on a Shingle meal for veterans.

Telling—We researched military histories and gathered food stories to serve as the backdrop for the recipes. Organized chronologically, the book traces the doughnut girls of World War I to sugar rationing of World War II and effects of industrialization.
