

Republic of Checkland
Bill No. 2026-BCA-10
Legislative Classification and Distinction Act

Preamble

For the purpose of ensuring clarity, order, and proper legislative procedure within the Republic of Checkland, this Act establishes the formal distinction between Grand Bills and standard Bills.

Section 1 — Definition of a Grand Bill

A Grand Bill shall be defined as any proposed law that:

1. Amends or alters the Constitution of Checkland
2. Establishes, abolishes, or significantly restructures branches or institutions of government
3. Introduces major national systems, programs, or reforms
4. Produces wide reaching and long term effects on the State

Section 2 — Definition of a Standard Bill

A standard Bill shall be defined as any proposed law that:

1. Addresses specific issues or policy areas without altering the structure of the State
2. Implements, enforces, or regulates existing frameworks
3. Has limited or moderate scope in impact
4. Does not meet the criteria of a Grand Bill

Section 3 — Determination of Classification

The classification of a proposed law as a Grand Bill or standard Bill shall be determined by:

1. The Speaker of the Digital Grand Assembly, or
2. A majority vote of the Assembly if classification is disputed

Section 4 — Supremacy of Classification

No law may be introduced or passed under improper classification. Any misclassified Bill may be challenged and reclassified prior to final passage.

Section 5 — Jurisdiction

This Act shall apply to all legislative processes post its passage within the Republic of Checkland.

Section 6 — Effect

This Act shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Digital Grand Assembly and receipt of Royal Assent.
