- [Perseus Scaife](#) - Perseus project is basically attempted open-source Loeb
- [PackHUM](#) - Latin texts, easy to browse, read, and search occurrence of forms (good for challenges)
- [UMich Reading the Papyri](#) - not that many texts, but teaches how to read papyri as they were written in both Greek and Latin (requires TJ proxy)
- [Ancient Greece Reloaded](#) - lists of ancient Greek texts with and without translation, as well as vocab lists - besides this webpage on texts, the website looks sketchy but has a ton of useful resources in myth and hellenic geography and literature (and the zodiac.)
