- 1. Jot down your name next to the city you're working on (and let's see if we can get 2 or 3 people to be working with each city.)
- 2. On the map look for heated areas that show where members of **highly different socio-economic backgrounds** might meet. Add some interesting representative location names and try to decide on what kinds of places these are.
- 3. Now look for non-diverse meeting points: what kinds of places seem to draw people only from the same backgrounds? Add some interesting representative location names and try to decide on what kinds of places these are.
