

# **AEA Computer Science Support & Department of Education Funding Opportunities**

The AEAs are equipped to support districts in preparing their computer science plans to meet the requirements of the Future Ready Iowa Act, <u>House File 2629</u>, which requires all districts to have a computer science plan in place by July 1, 2022. Below is a summary of the requirements for districts, a timeline of when the requirements should be in place, and resources, training and funding available to help districts prepare for next year's deadline.

# A Timeline of Computer Science Plan Milestones and Deadlines:

#### District K-12 CS Plan

• By July 1, 2022: All public and non-public districts must have developed and be ready to implement a K-12

computer science plan.

Required Instruction

• Starting July 2022: High schools must offer and teach one-half unit of computer science. The course may

offered online.

Starting July 2023: Provide computer science instruction aligned to the standards in at least one grade

level

from 1st to 6th.

Provide computer science instruction aligned to the standards in at least one grade.

 Starting July 2023: Provide computer science instruction aligned to the standards in at least one grade level

from 7th to the 8th.
